LAOS People & History



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Laos has a rich and complex history shaped by its diverse ethnic groups and geographical position in Southeast Asia. The kingdom of Lan Xang, established in the 14th century, marked a golden era for Laos.

In the late 19th century, Laos became part of French Indochina, which significantly impacted its political and economic structures. Following World War II, Laos gained independence in 1953 but soon became embroiled in the Vietnam War, leading to a devastating civil war. In 1975, Lao established the Lao People's Democratic Republic.

Sin Ho – Traditional Scarf

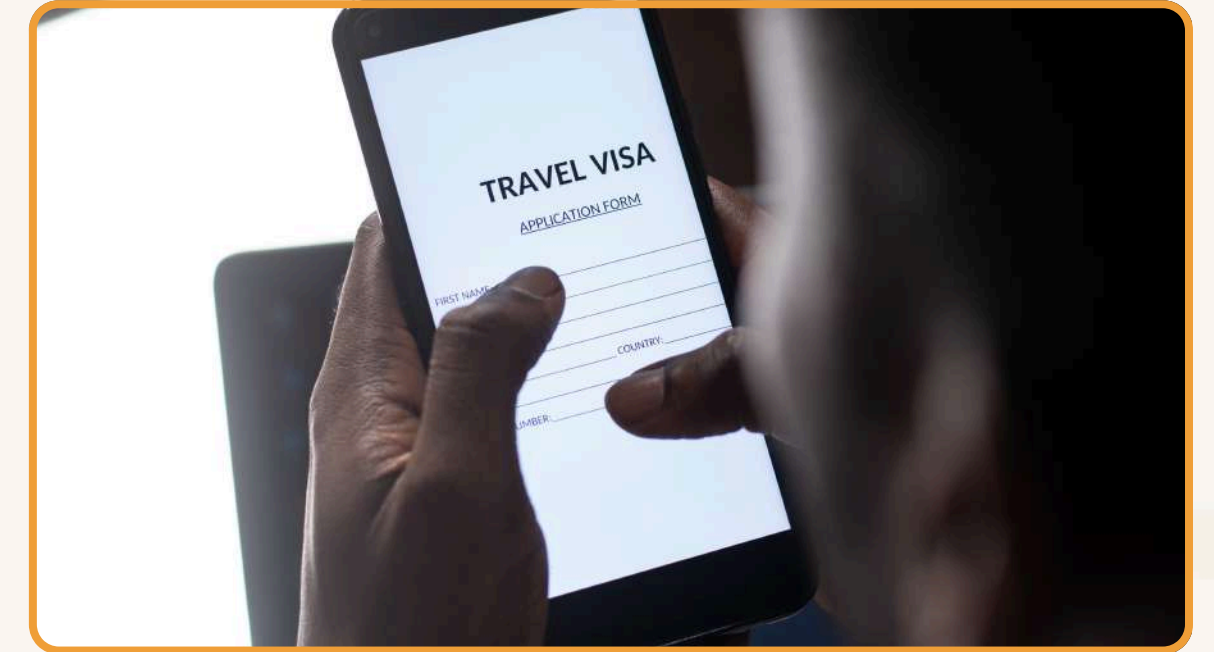

The Sinh

Lao traditional dress, particularly the Sinh for women, showcases the country's vibrant culture and artistry. The Sinh is a beautifully woven skirt that comes in a variety of colors and designs, often embellished with intricate patterns that reflect local traditions. For men, the traditional attire includes a formal shirt paired with a sarong-like garment, presenting a polished and elegant look.





Laos Visa Exemption

Regular passport holders from the following countries do not need a tourist visa for Laos:

- **14 days:** Myanmar
- **15 days:** Japan, Luxembourg, and Switzerland
- **30 days:** Brunei Darussalam Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Mongolia, Philippines, Russia, Singapore, South Korea, Thailand, and Vietnam.

Laos Visa On Arrival

Laos Visa On Arrival (VOA) is available at international airports and some border checkpoints.

Important:

- Passport has at least 6 months of validity
- The Visa on Arrival is worked if travelers enter Laos via International airports
- Travelers must provide two (02) photos of passport-type.
- A visa application form is filled up and signed by the applicant (available at the Visa booth.)
- You need to prepare some USD cash for the visa fee (ranging from USD 30 to 45 per person depend on nationality, plus extra small charge on dates of arrival).

Laos E-Visa

Laos has opened a new E-visa service granted by the Lao Government Authorities to enable 144 countries to apply for a visa online.

Important:

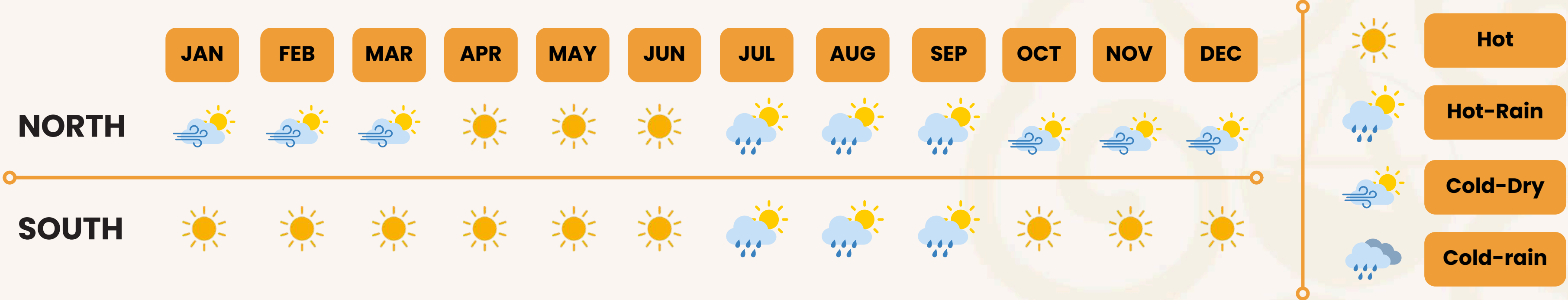
- Passport with a validity of no less than six months.
- One color 4x6 cm photo in digital format.
- E-visa fee of USD (the fee depends on the traveler's nationality and is non-refundable).
- The policies for Laos e-visa may change over time, you should get more information from: www.laoevisa.gov.la before your travel.

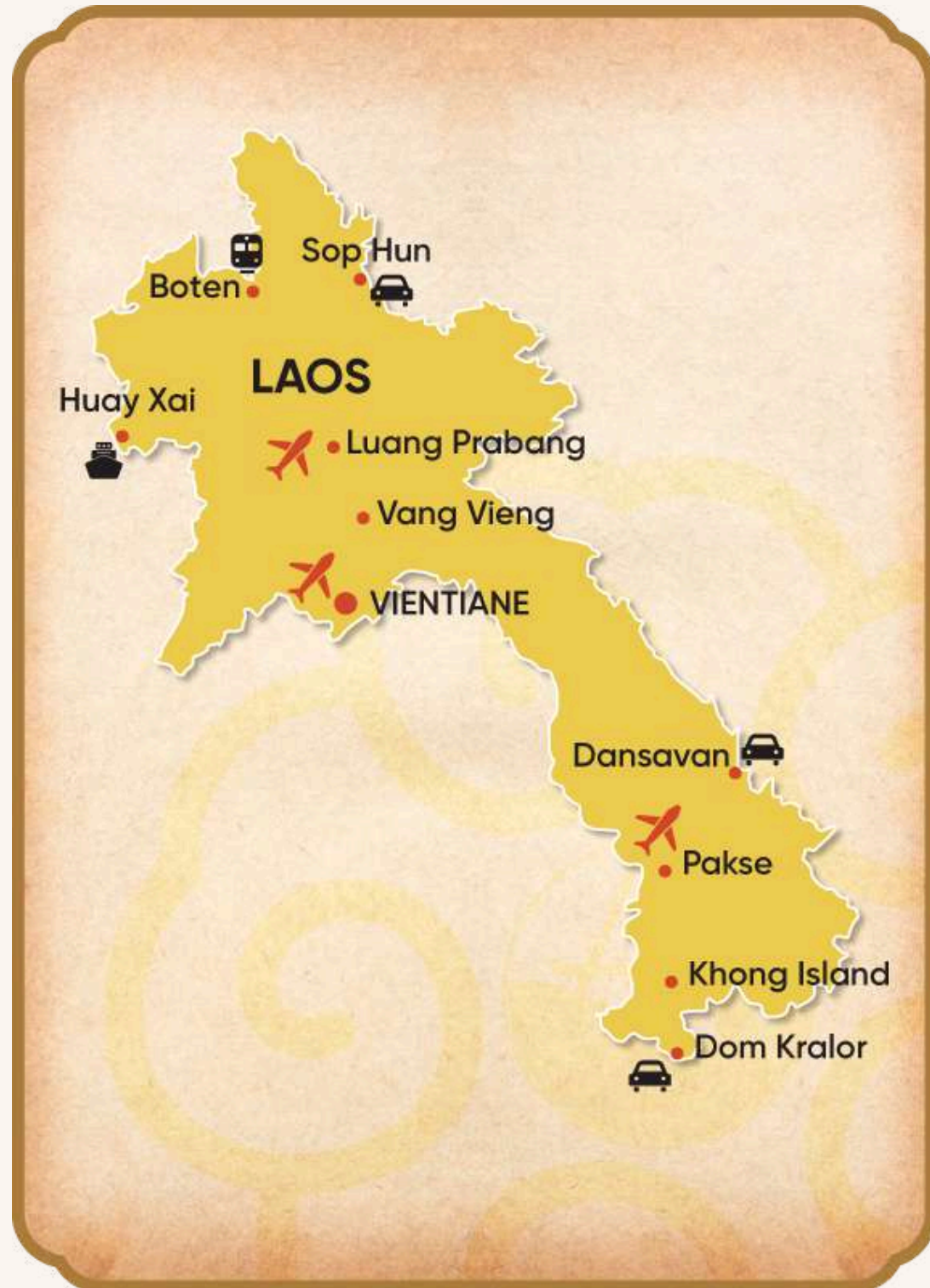


LAOS Weather & When to go

Road Conditions: Laos' road infrastructure is improving, but rural areas may still have unpaved or rough roads. Be prepared for uneven surfaces, especially in the countryside.

Mountainous terrain: Roads in northern Laos, like those to Luang Prabang and Vang Vieng, pass through hilly and mountainous regions. Expect winding routes and slower travel times.

Traffic rules: Laos drives on the right-hand side. While traffic is generally light in rural areas, cities like Vientiane can experience congestion. In Luang Prabang, only vehicles less than 25 seats are allowed to travel in town.

Transport Options: Aurora Travel & DMC offers 4, 7, 16, and 45-seater vehicles in the main destinations. The 7, 16-seater are frequently utilized in small towns: Luang Prabang & Vangvieng.

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Convenient travel: The railway offers a faster and more comfortable option compared to long bus rides, especially for journeys between Vientiane and Luang Prabang, which is only 1.45 hours on high-speed train.

Modern facilities: High-speed train on the Laos-China Railway are equipped with modern amenities like air conditioning, clean restrooms, and comfortable seating.

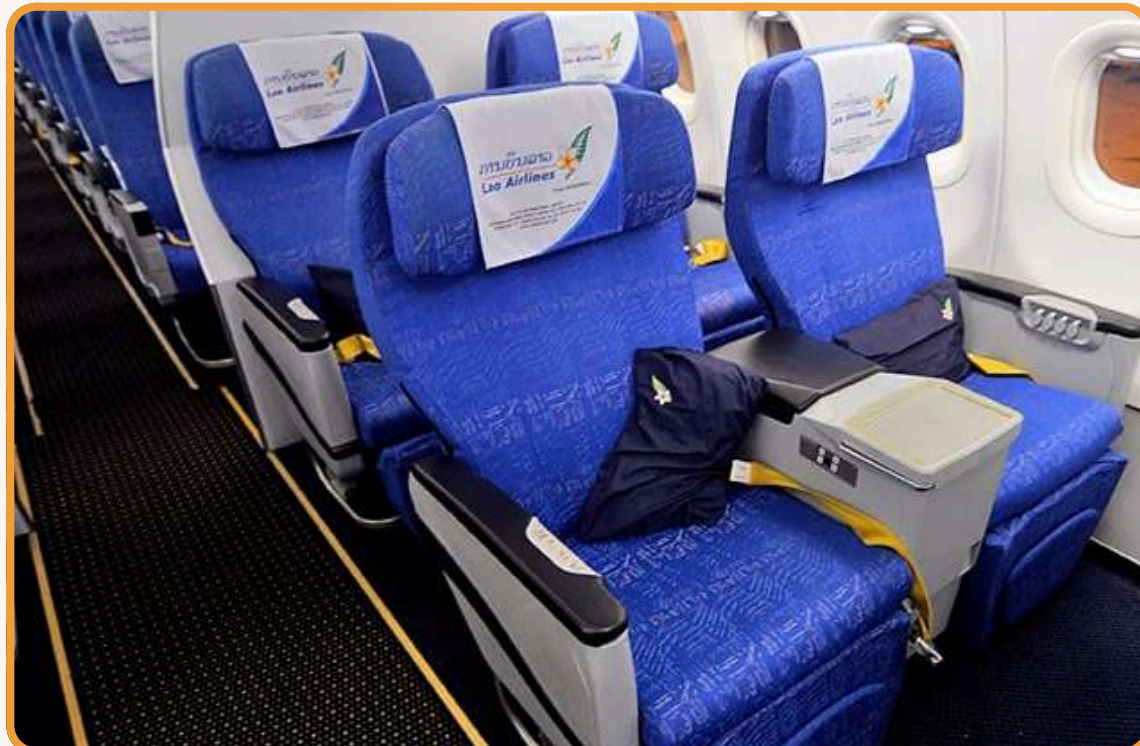

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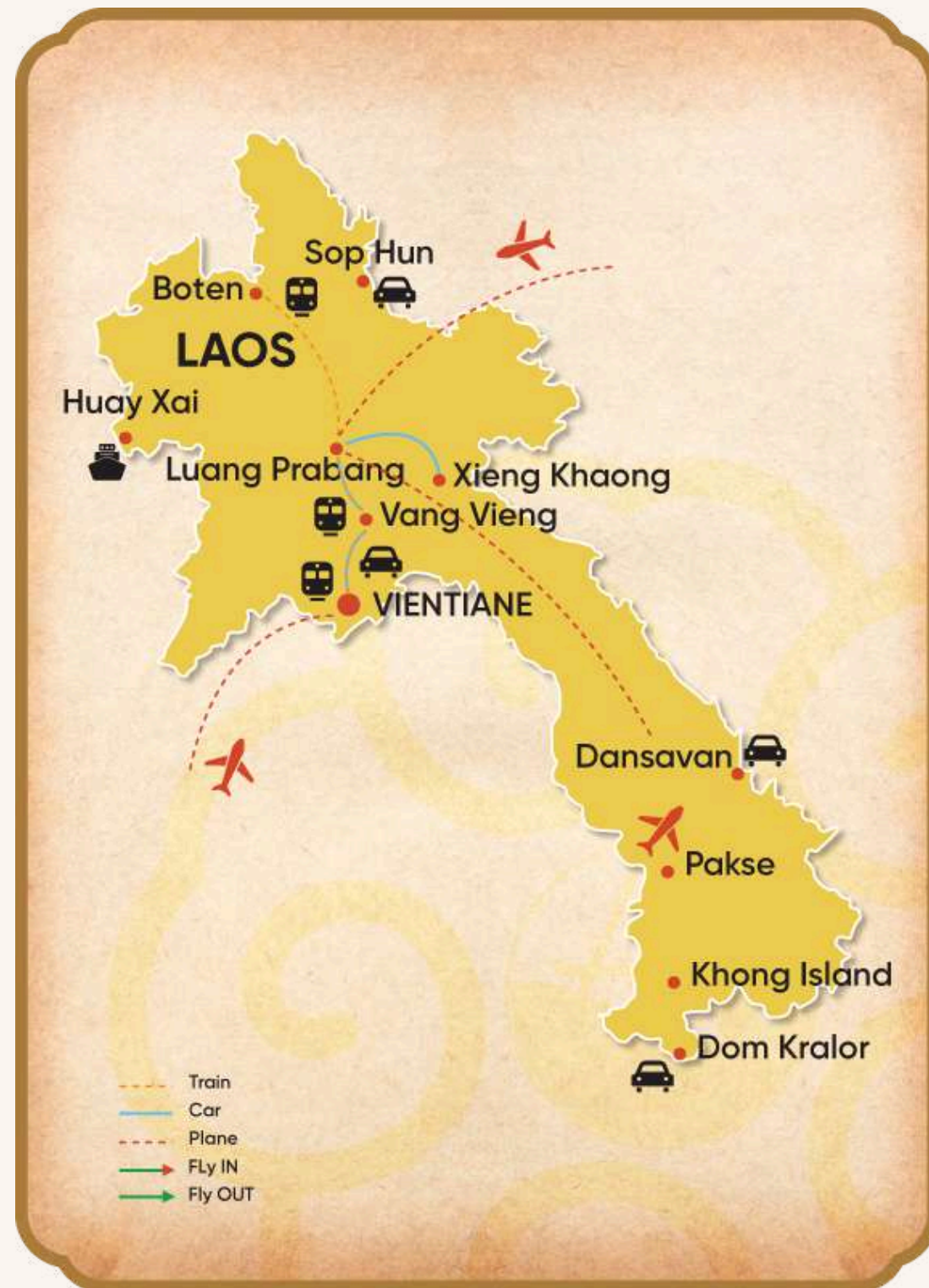

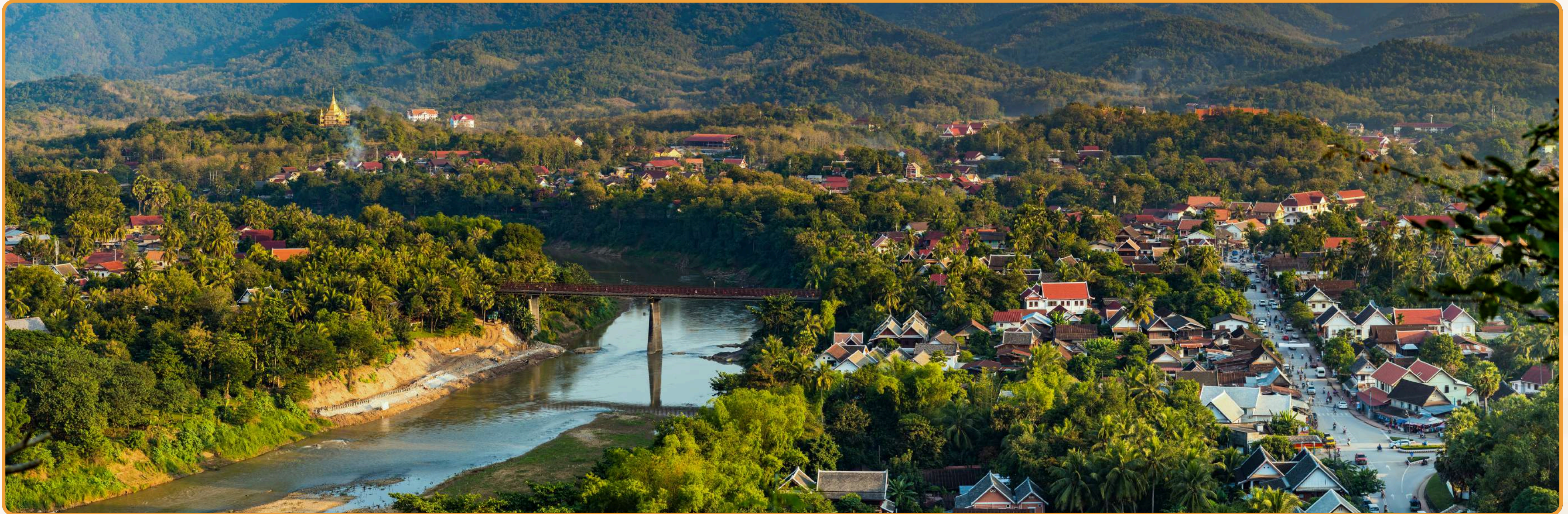

LUANG PRABANG - THE TIMELESS JEWEL



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UNESCO-listed town in northern Laos, known for its rich cultural heritage, stunning temples, and natural beauty. Set along the banks of the Mekong River and surrounded by lush mountains, it offers a blend of traditional Lao architecture and French colonial charm. visitors can explore the ancient Buddhist temples, such as the iconic Wat Xieng Thong, witness the daily alms-giving ceremony by monks, and enjoy the vibrant night market.

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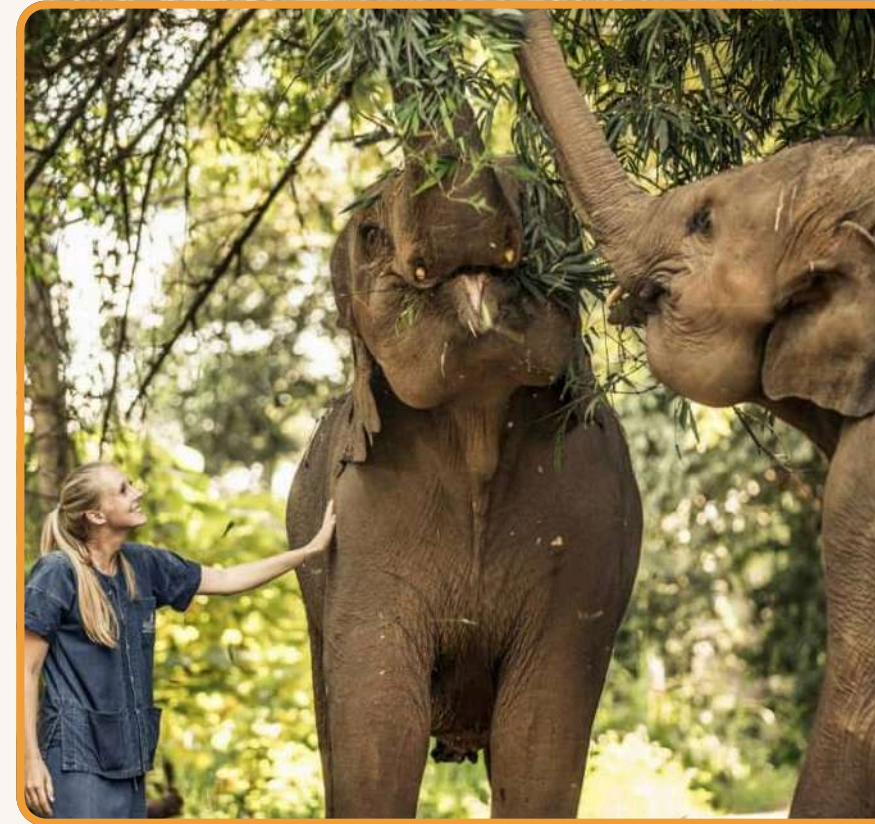
Rice Farming Experience

Get on board a luxury boat for a premium waterway to explore these ancient shrines.



VIENTIANE - THE SERENE HEART OF LAOS



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Vientiane, the capital of Laos, offers a laid-back charm unlike many other bustling capitals in Southeast Asia. Located on the banks of the Mekong River, this city is a mix of French colonial architecture and Buddhist temples. Key attractions include Pha That Luang, the golden stupa and national symbol of Laos, and Patuxai, a war memorial resembling the Arc de Triomphe.

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Tour The Buddha Park

Buddha Park, called Xieng Khuan, is a fanciful open-air sculpture garden that houses over 200 giant sculptures of Buddha and Hindu deities. One of the most striking sculptures is a giant pumpkin with three floors representing Hell, Earth, and Heaven.

Begin your trek with an orchid expert on narrow dirt trails winding its way through the jungle. Observe wildlife up close while learning about the forest including its many medicinal plants and non-timber forest products. You will be impressed by the abundance of orchids. There are over 25,000 species of orchids in the world and 300 of them can be found in the hidden park.



VANGVIENG - THE ADVENTURE PLAYGROUND



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Vang Vieng, nestled between limestone mountains and the Nam Song River, is a paradise for nature lovers and adventure seekers. Famous for its stunning karst landscapes, this town offers a range of outdoor activities such as kayaking, tubing, and rock climbing. Visitors can explore ancient caves like Tham Chang Cave, enjoy breathtaking views from scenic hikes, or relax by the river's edge. The town has a laid-back vibe with cozy riverside cafes with a lively scene.

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Vangvieng Discovery

Spend a whole day hiking through the Lao countryside, visiting caves and rural farms. Tham Hoi, which winds its way deep into the mountain with a crystal clear spring at the end, swimmable when the cave is lit up by candles; and Tham Loup, the most beautiful cave in the area, known for its amazing stalagmites and stalactites.



The Blue Lagoon Adventure

The Blue Lagoon is a must-see for anyone visiting Vang Vieng, even if they simply desire to escape the heat for a few hours. It is a tourist destination for lazy days, having a laugh, and a beer or two with your travel partners.



Kayaking Experience

A full-day kayaking and hiking tour allows you to explore the stunningly unspoiled area surrounding Vang Vieng. Explore some of the area's intriguing caves, such as Tham Sang (Elephant Cave), and Tham Hoi (Snail Cave). Spend 45 minutes exploring the dark cave that turns its way 3 kilometers (2 miles) into the mountain; and Tham Nam (Water tunnel).



XIENG KHUANG - THE PLAIN OF MYSTERY



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Xieng Khuang Located in northeastern Laos, is a destination rich in history and mystery. Known for the enigmatic Plain of Jars, this province is home to thousands of ancient stone jars scattered across its rolling hills, believed to date back over 2,000 years. Xieng Khuang also offers a glimpse into the region's war history, with remnants of the Vietnam War still visible in its landscapes. Visitors can explore peaceful villages, and meet the friendly Hmong and Khmu communities.





Discovering Plain of Jars and Muang Kham

Visit the mysterious Plain of Jars, which was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2019. This place is home to thousands of magnificent stone jars. Gain significant insight into this archeological extravaganza of huge carved jars, set against a lovely environment of rolling hills dotted with pine trees and green grass during the wet season. They are 2500-3000 years old, and no one knows why they were created.



Retracing the Ancient Capital Of Muang Khoun

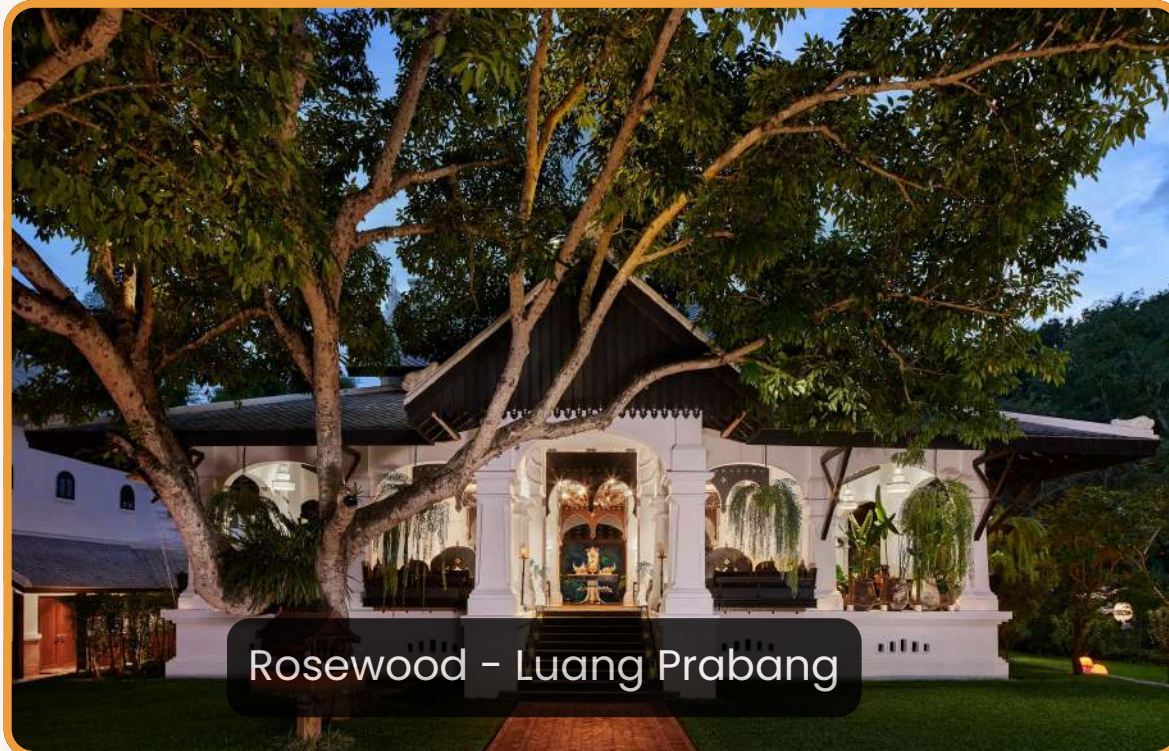
Travel back in time to Muang Khoun, the 14th-century royal capital of the small country Xieng Khuang. The town was extensively attacked during the Second Indochina War. Explore the ruins of this once opulent town starting with Wat Phia temple, which is the compound enclosing both new temples and several remaining temples built between the 16th and 19th centuries. This is an excellent opportunity to learn more about the history of Buddhism and Laotian national pride during the Indochina war.

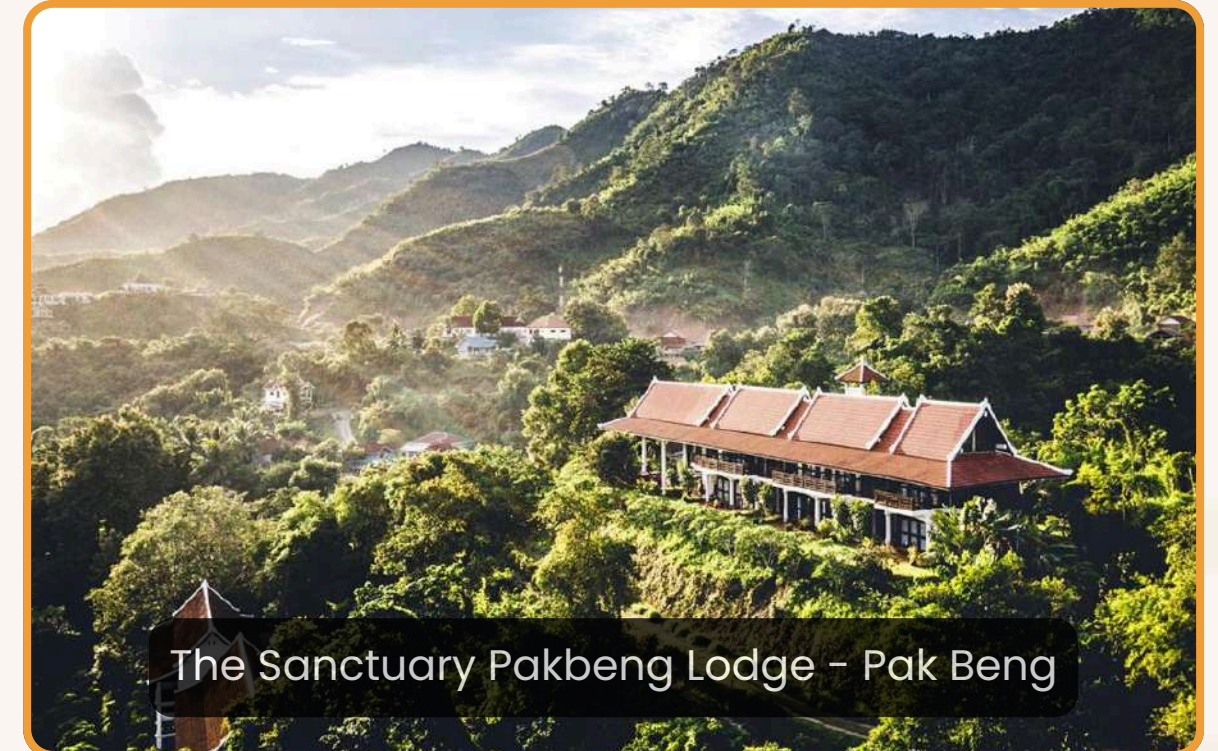

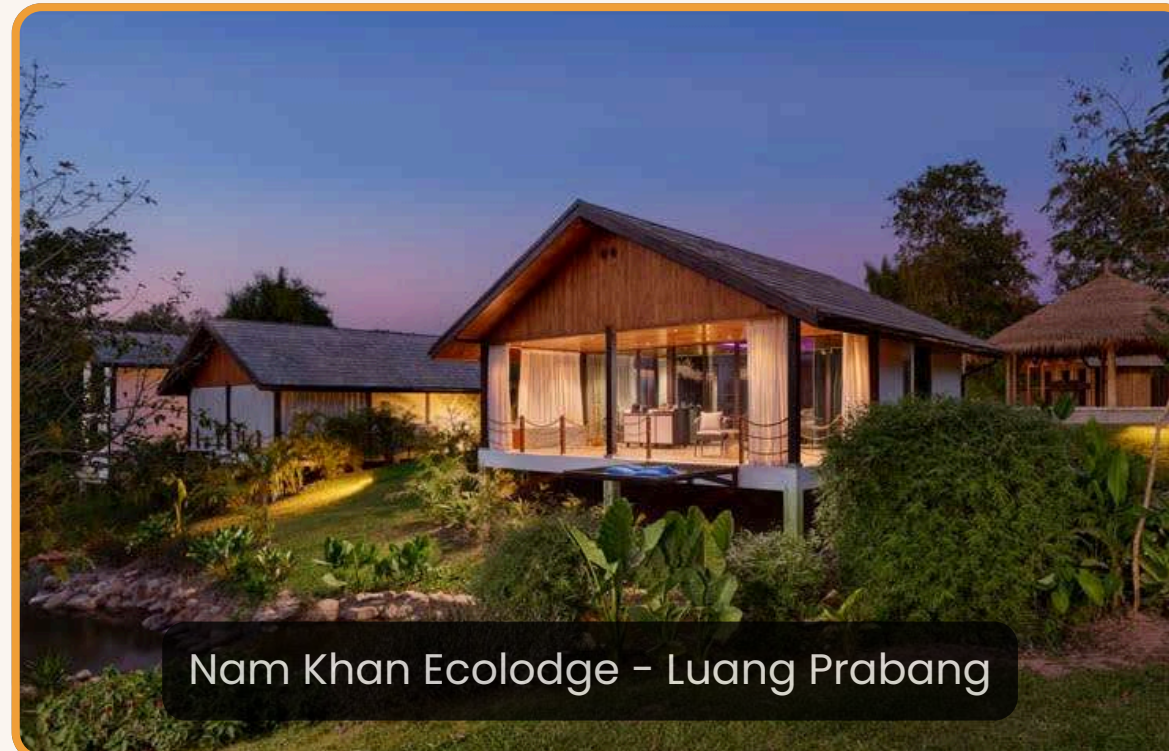

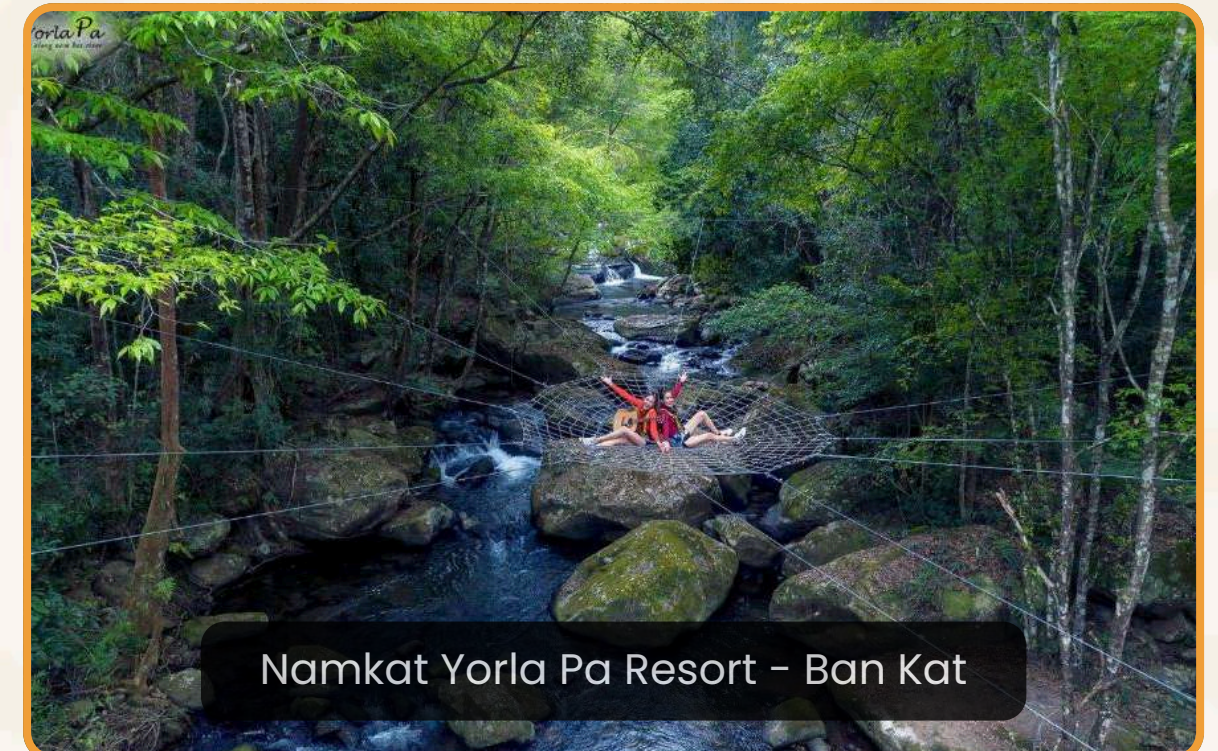

What To Eat When Visit Northern LAOS



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Khao Soi

A Laotian version of the famous noodle soup, typically made with hand-pulled rice noodles in a flavorful broth, served with minced pork or beef, fresh herbs, and a touch of chili.



Sai Oua (Lao Sausage)

A delicious, aromatic sausage made from minced pork, lemongrass, garlic, and herbs, often served grilled or fried.



Tam Mak Hoong (Green Papaya Salad)

A spicy and tangy salad made from shredded green papaya, lime, garlic, chili, and fish sauce. It's similar to the Thai version but with its own Laotian twist.



Or Lam

A comforting stew from the Luang Prabang region, featuring meat (buffalo, pork, or chicken), eggplants, mushrooms, and herbs like lemongrass and dill.



Ping Pa (Grilled Fish)

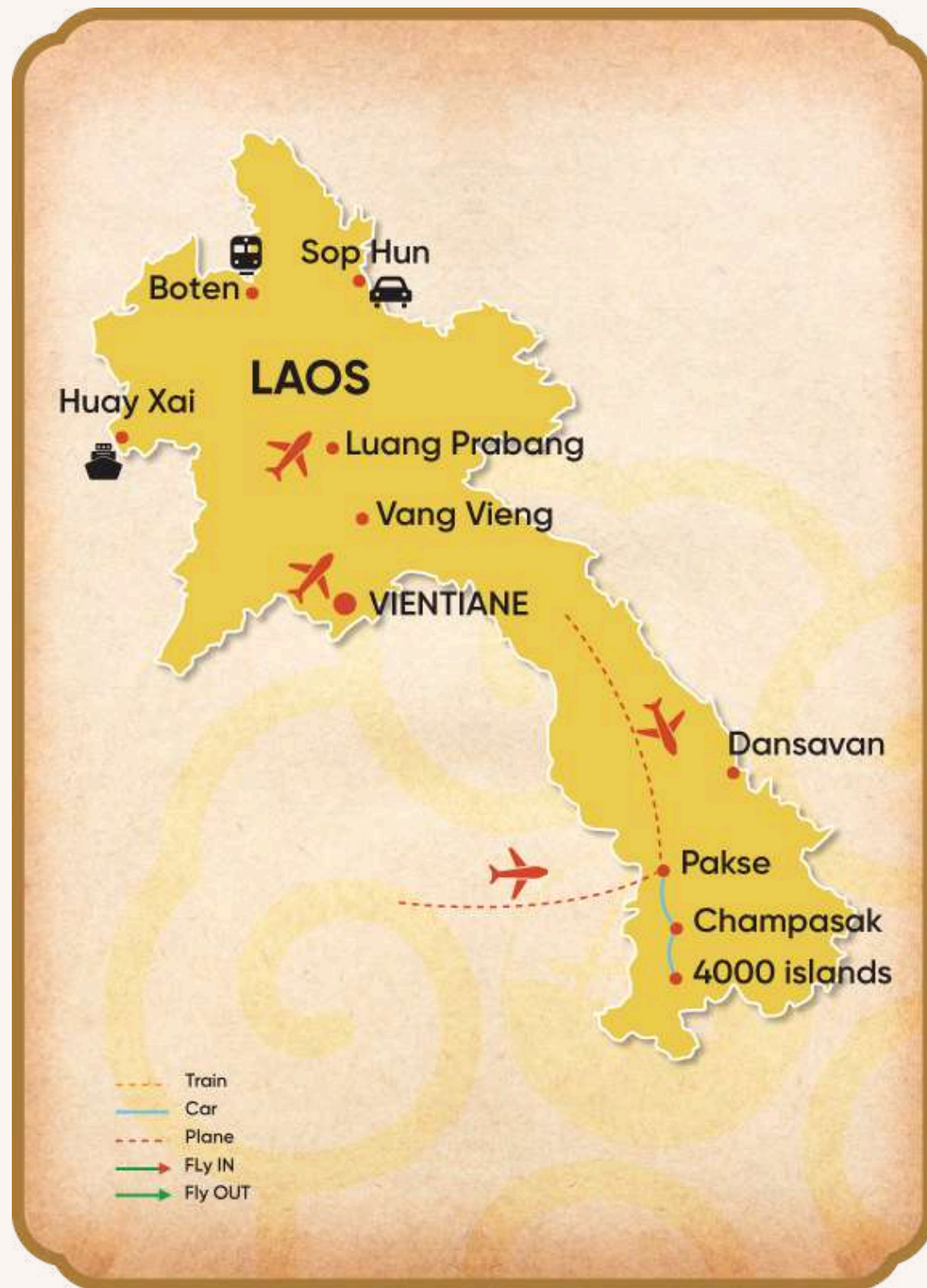
Fresh fish, often caught from the Mekong River, grilled to perfection with herbs and spices.

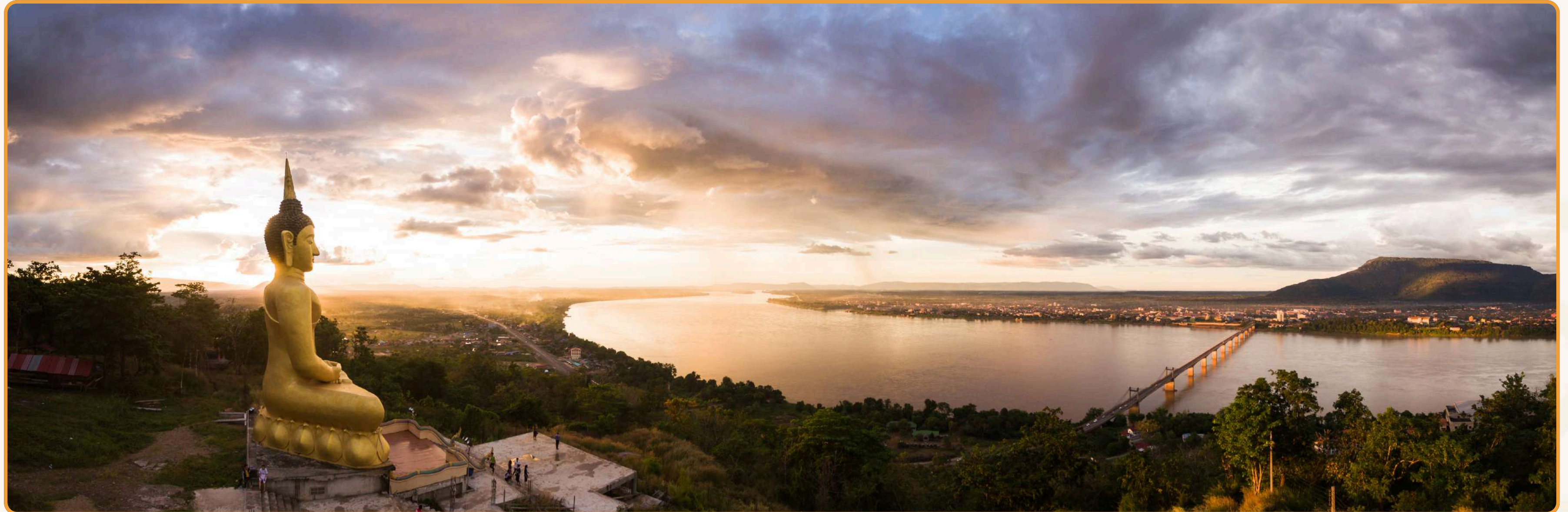

PAKSE - THE GATEWAY TO THE SOUTH



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Nestled at the confluence of the Mekong and Xe Don rivers, it serves as the gateway to some of the region's most stunning natural and cultural attractions. Pakse is also a great base for visiting the UNESCO-listed Wat Phou, an ancient Khmer temple complex set against a dramatic mountain backdrop. The city itself offers a charming mix of French colonial architecture, bustling markets, and serene river views, making it a perfect starting point for exploring the beauty and heritage of Southern Laos.

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Ban Don Khor: The Buddha Stone Carving Village

Ban Don Khor, also known as Wat Chompet, is located 13 kilometers north of Pakse. Spend time with the local artisans who carve traditional Buddha statues. Take the time to admire the delicate process of stone carving; some are as small as the palm of your hand, while others are life-size.



A Glimpse Of Hillside Resort Town Of Pakse

The location adjacent to the mouths of the Mekong and Don rivers is one of Pakse's most attractive features. Soak in the sun as it sets over the picturesque riverbank while sipping a Beerlao. Visit the magnificent colonial buildings in town that are among the finest examples of the opulent style of architecture.



Wat Phou Salao and Mekong River

The huge golden Buddha statue overlooking the city serves as the centerpiece of this hilltop temple across the Mekong from Pakse. The views from the vantage point are as spectacular as you would anticipate, particularly around sunset.



Memorable Nights At Tree House At Ban Nongluang National Park

Engage in an adventure package that will bring you in close touch with nature and show you about the local culture and traditions. Let's stroll past flower-studded plateaus, ravines, and picturesque waterfalls as you make your way from coffee farms and vegetable gardens to untamed semi-evergreen forests.

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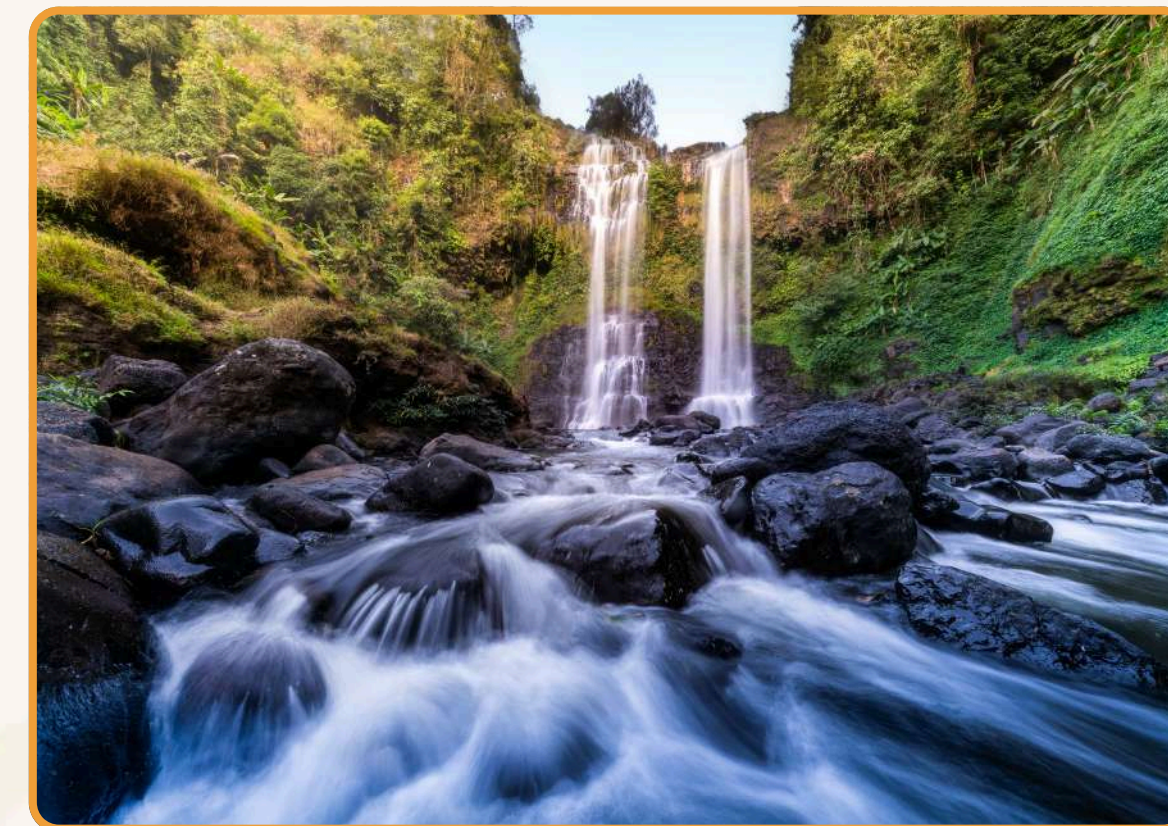
Tour The Wat Phou Temple

Champasak is a charming one-street village known for its beautiful pre-Angkorian Wat Phou Temple. The temple, which dates back to the 10th and early 11th centuries, was inscribed as a World Heritage Site in 2001.



Don Daeng Island

Don Daeng, located inside the Champassak Cultural and Natural Heritage Landscape, features a variety of pre-Angkorian remains and provides insight into ancient practices such as basket making, fishing, and rice farming. Enjoy a cycling trip around the island on a rustic path shaded by different types of trees.



Bolaven Plateau Exploration

Formed by an ancient volcano and famed for some of Laos' most spectacular waterfalls, and tranquil hill tribe villages, the Bolaven Plateau is one of the little-known highlights of southern Laos. Indulge in the genuine culture of the local hill indigenous people as you take in the breathtaking scenery of the region's coffee farms, dense forests, and magnificent waterfalls.



SI PHAN DON (4000 ISLANDS) - THE 4,000 ISLANDS



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Si Phan Don, or the "4,000 Islands," is a serene paradise located in the Mekong River in southern Laos. Known for its laid-back atmosphere, Si Phan Don is famous for its picturesque islands, where time seems to slow down. Beyond relaxation, Si Phan Don offers unique experiences, including spotting the rare Irrawaddy dolphins in the Mekong, visiting the impressive Khone Phapheng Falls—the largest waterfall by volume in Southeast Asia.

Si Phan Don, which translates to 'Four Thousand Islands' in Lao, is a picturesque stretch of the Mekong River spanning around 50 kilometers. Si Phan Don has numerous islands, half of which are flooded when the Mekong River floods.

Crossing Border Experience

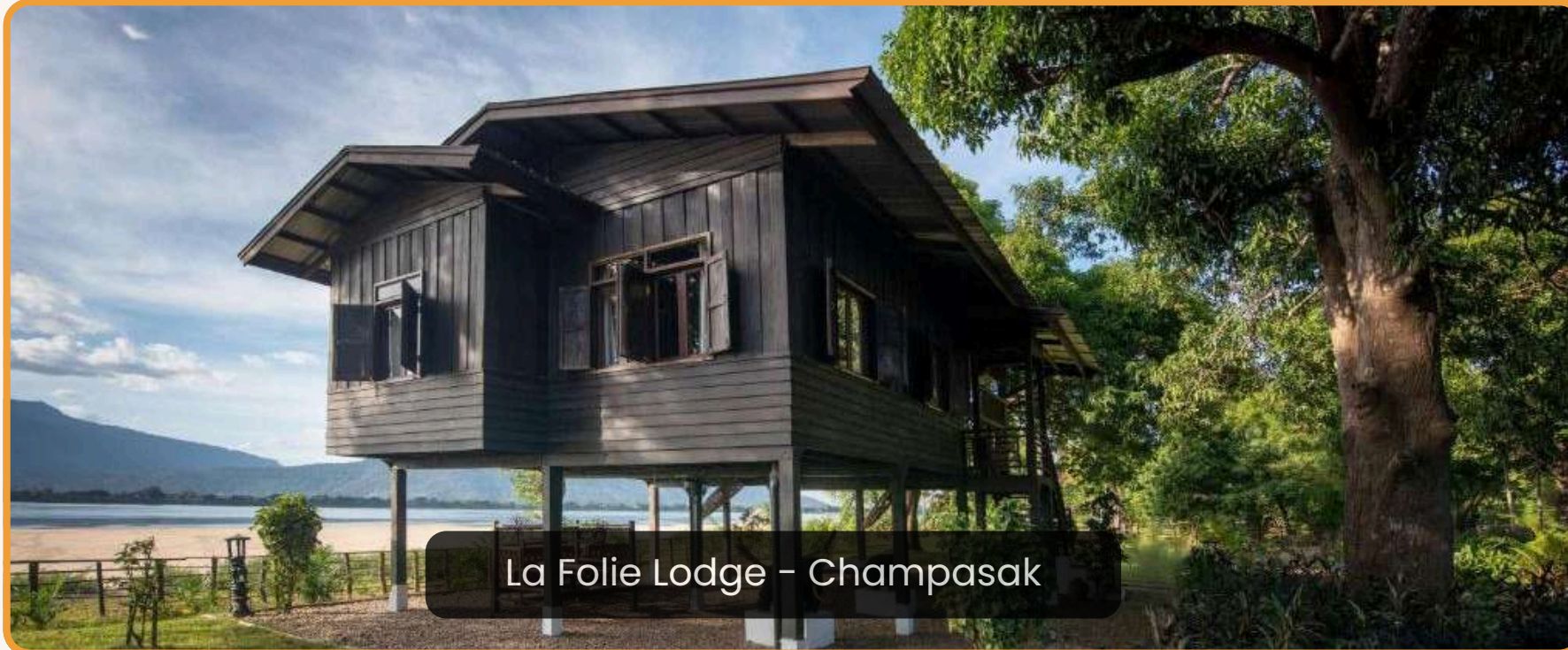

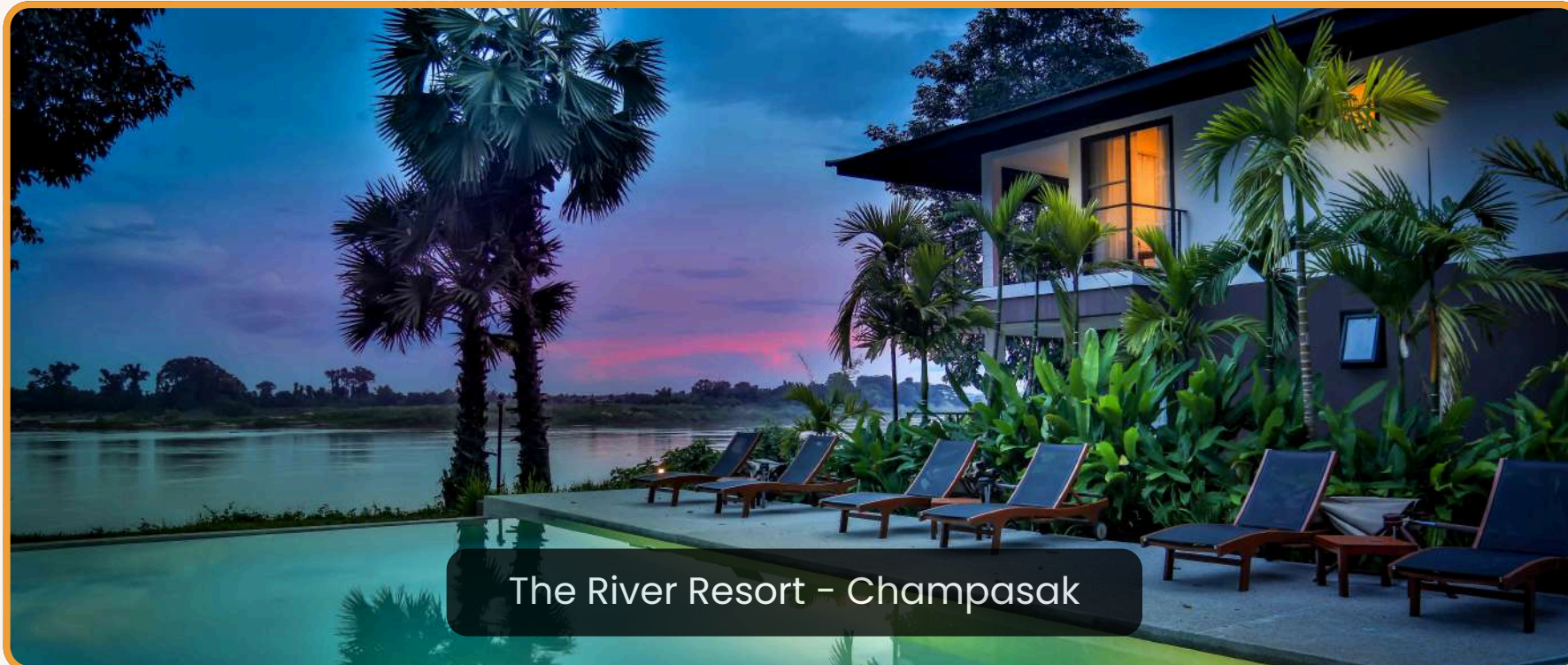

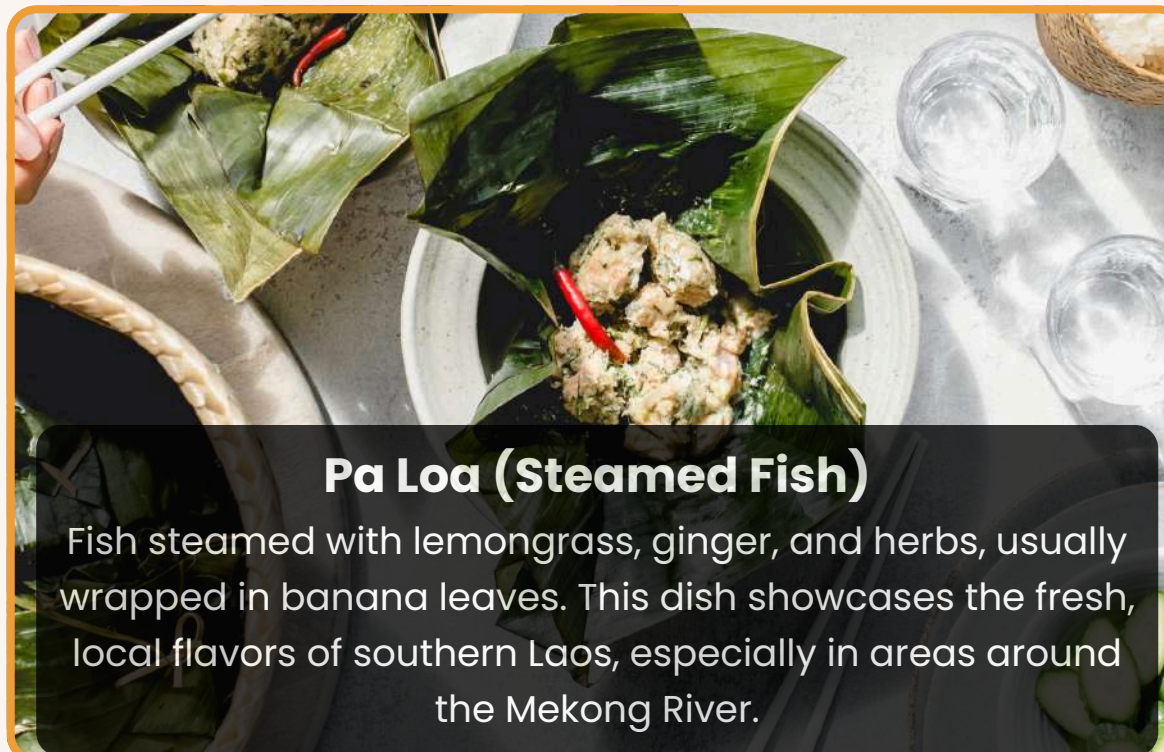


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Larb

A popular minced meat salad made from chicken, beef, pork, or fish, mixed with fresh herbs, lime juice, and toasted rice powder. It's a national dish of Laos and is often served with sticky rice.



Pa Loa (Steamed Fish)

Fish steamed with lemongrass, ginger, and herbs, usually wrapped in banana leaves. This dish showcases the fresh, local flavors of southern Laos, especially in areas around the Mekong River.



Khao Poon

A traditional Laotian vermicelli noodle soup with a coconut-based curry broth, typically made with chicken or pork and flavored with fish sauce, lemongrass, and fresh herbs.



Tom Som Pla (Sour Fish Soup)

A tangy and refreshing fish soup made with tamarind, lemongrass, tomatoes, and herbs, offering a balanced blend.



Ping Gai (Grilled Chicken)

Chicken marinated with garlic, coriander, and lemongrass, then grilled to a golden brown.

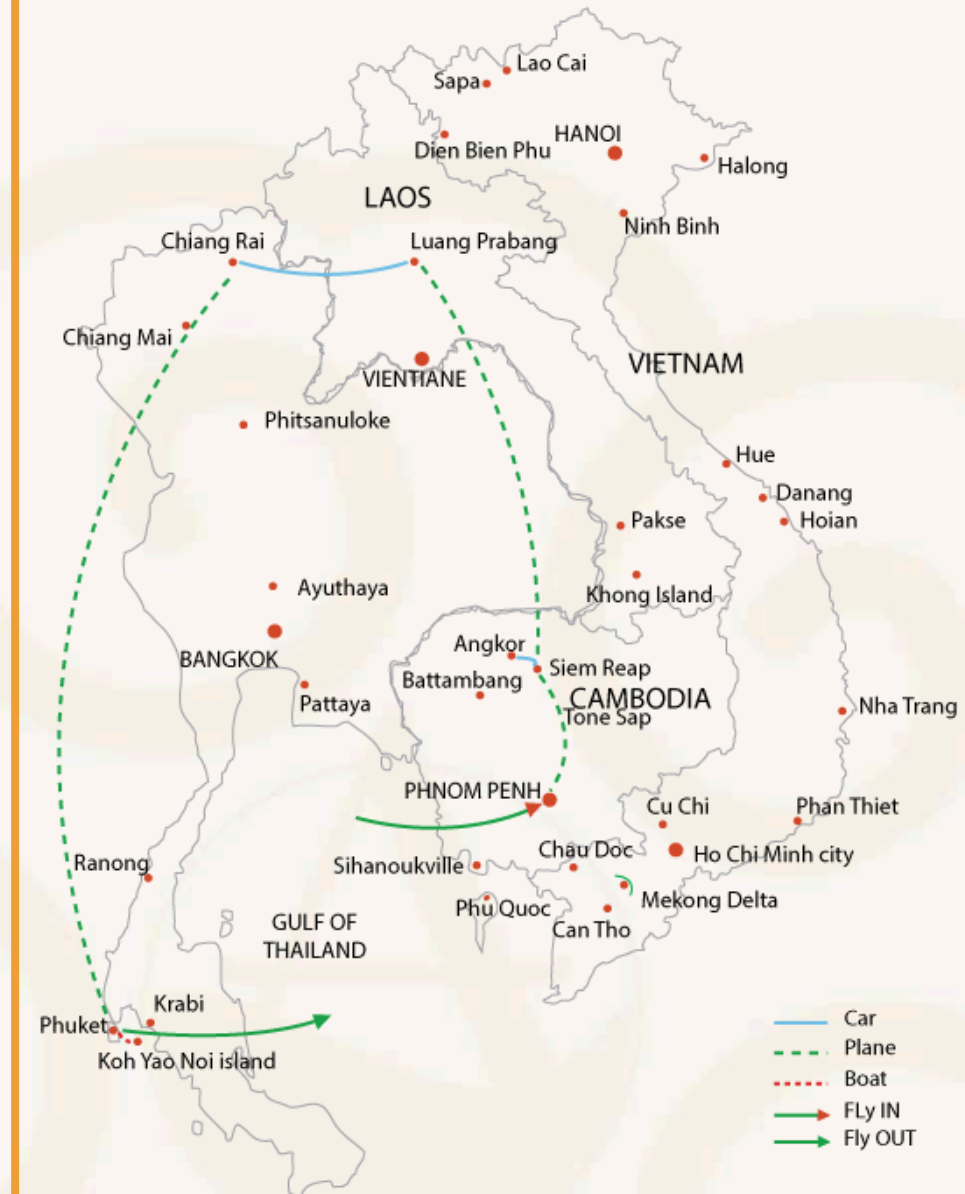
