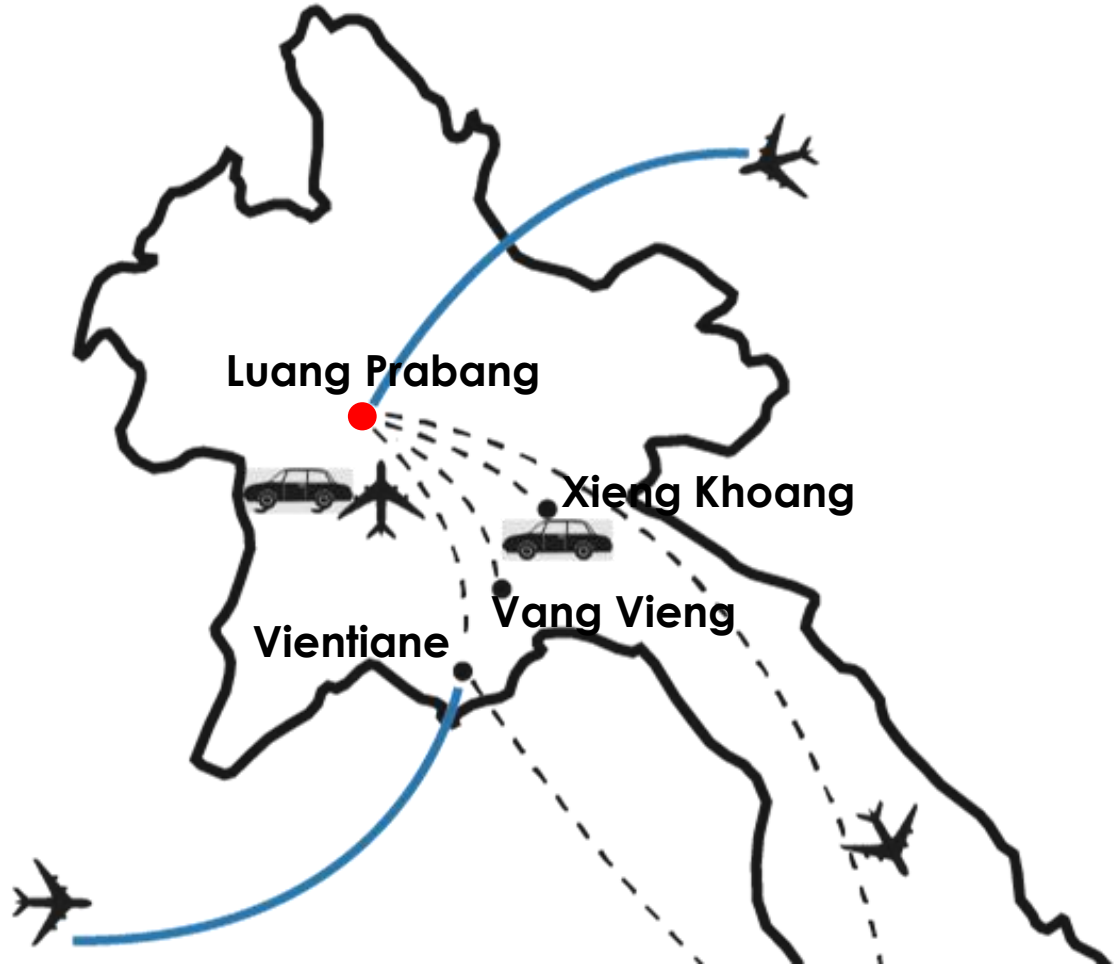

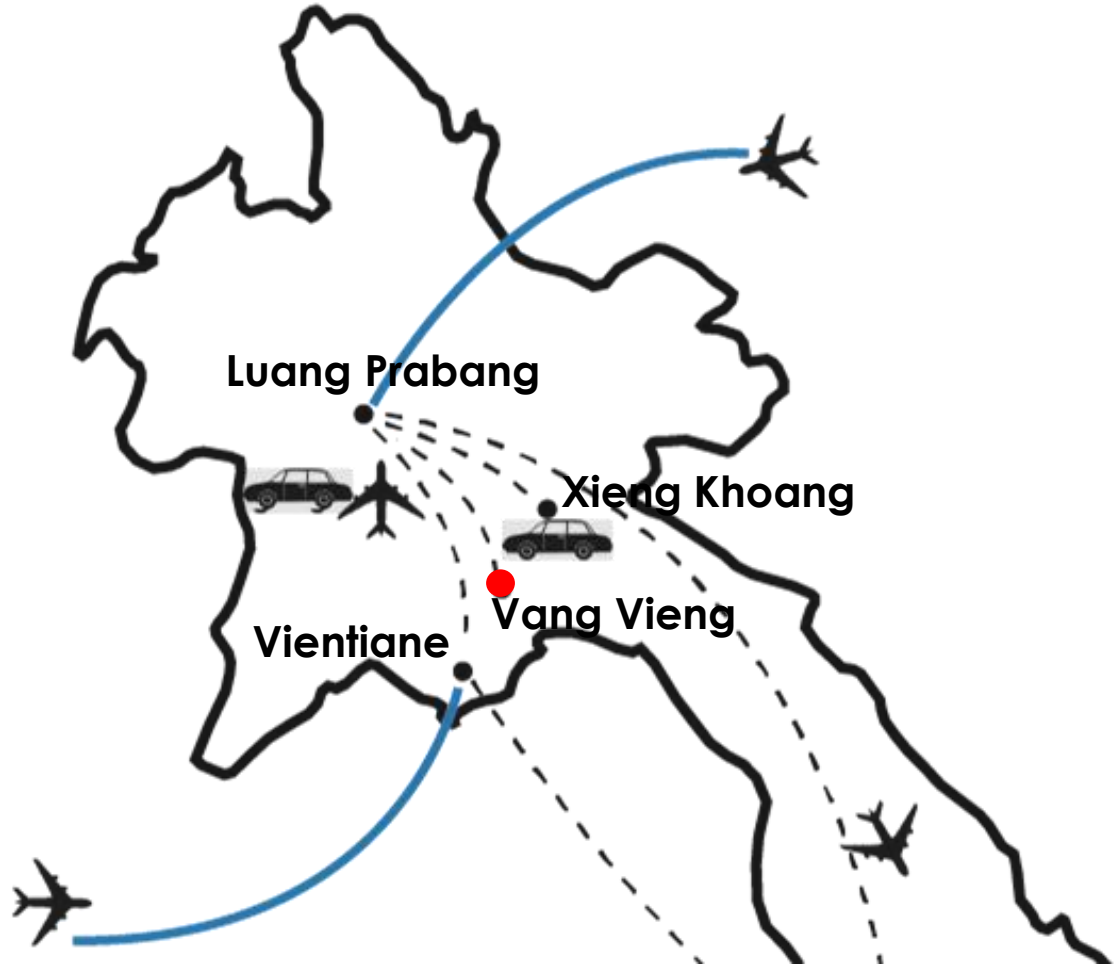

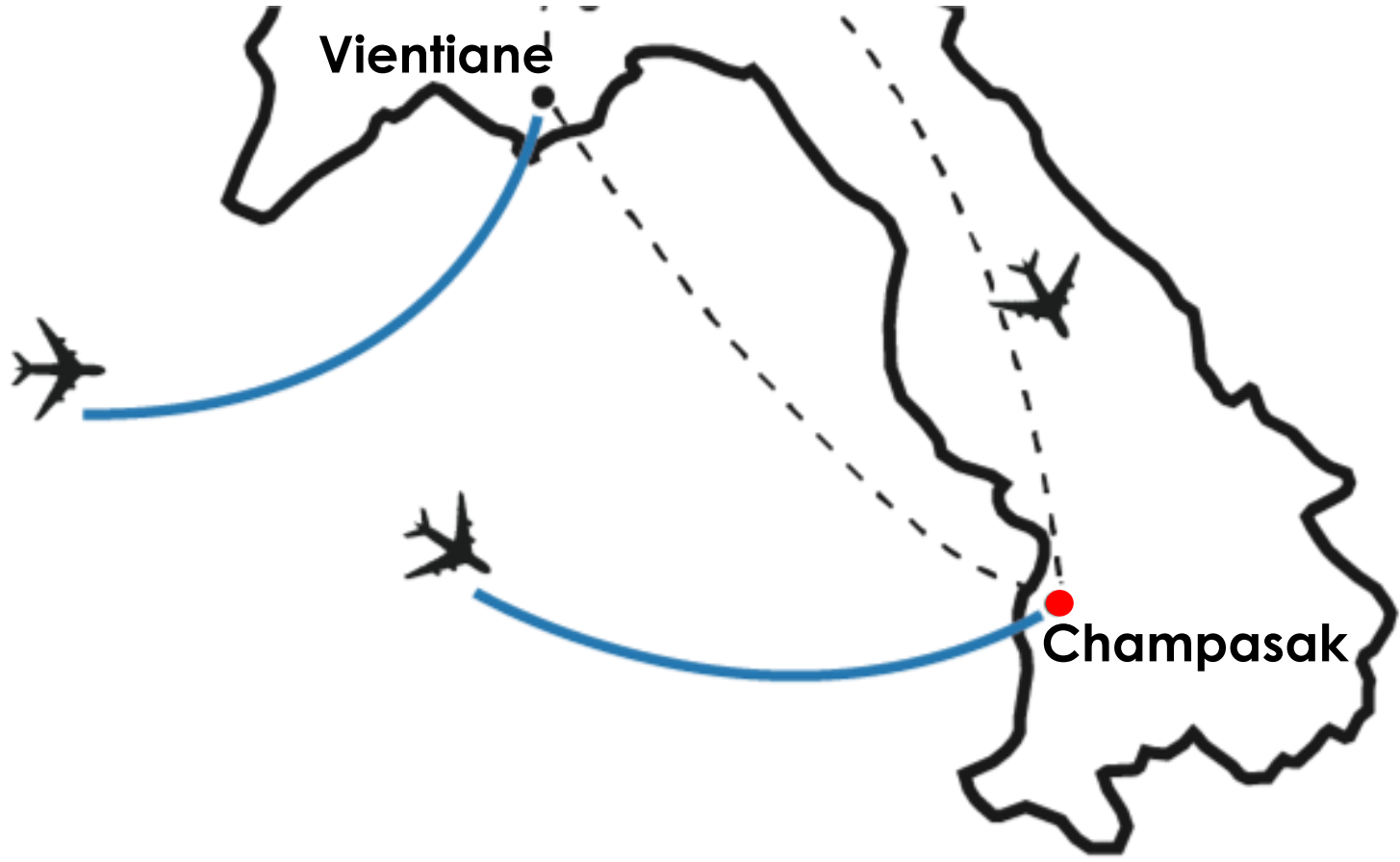

NO VISA REQUIREMENT WITHIN UNDER 30 DAYS

-  Myanmar
-  Indonesia
-  Brunei
-  Cambodia
-  Malaysia
-  Singapore
-  Thailand
-  Vietnam

Passport:

- A minimum validity of 6 months
- Have at least one and a half blank pages

Visa:

- **Visa on Arrival** is the most convenience way. Can obtain at international airports or land borders with Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand and China
- Also travelers can apply for **E-visa** before departure

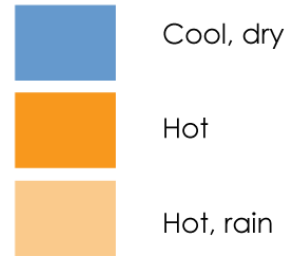
Weather & When to go



Best time: October till March (note to avoid Chines New Year either in Jan or Feb)
