



The H'mong have moved many times in their history. They are situated between China and Vietnam. They slowly migrated south. They are relatively independent, which has been threatened with political penetration from China, Vietnam, Thailand, Laos and Vietnam. They cluster. The H'mong Diaspora.

The Muu Yeo, commonly known as Indigo Yeo, meaning "Indigo Yeo" is a traditional dyeing technique where the cloth is dyed deep blue by hand with indigo. It is a traditional craft that requires skill and patience. The indigo plant is native to Southeast Asia. The origin of the Muu Yeo can be traced back to the 15th century. From the 15th to 19th century, the H'mong people migrated from China to Laos. This migration was driven by political pressure and environmental factors.





Passport:

- A minimum validity of 6 months
- Have at least one and a half blank pages


Visa:

- **Visa on Arrival** is the most convenience way. Can obtain at international airports or land borders with Vietnam, Cambodia, Thailand and China
- Also travelers can apply for **E-visa** before departure

Weather & When to go



Best time: October till March (note to avoid Chinese New Year either in Jan or Feb)



Summer: April and May are the hottest

Rainy Season: Jun to September (monsoons)
