THAILAND People & History

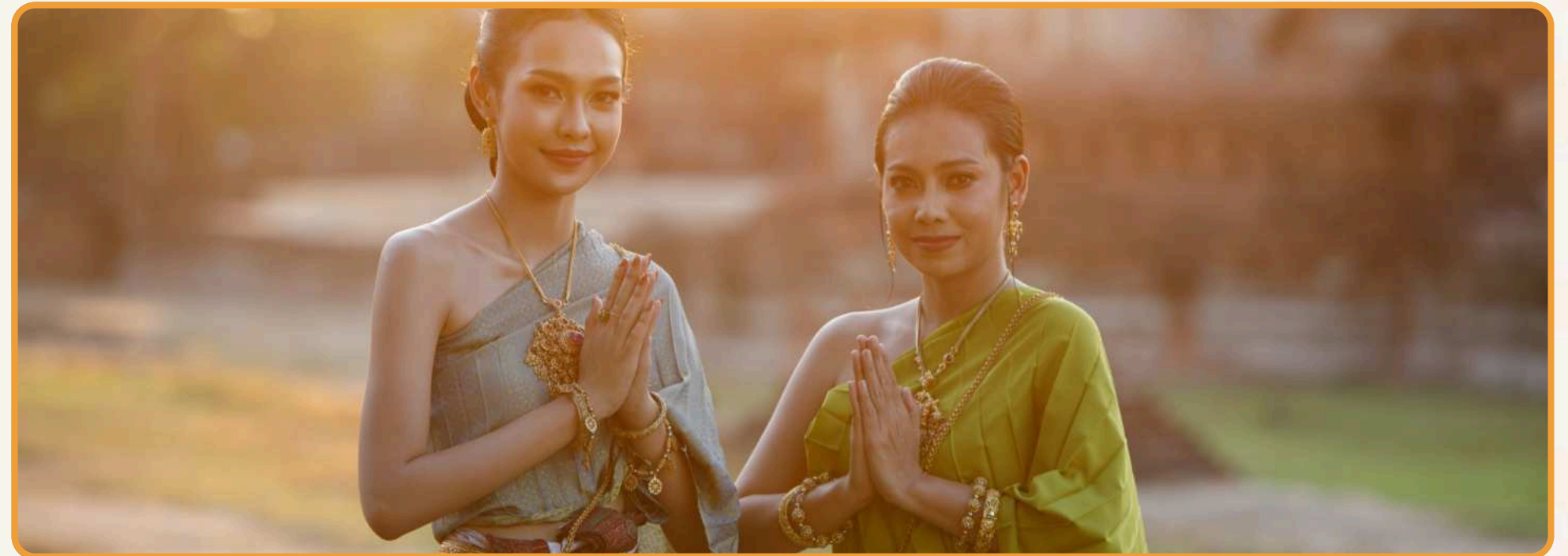


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Thailand was originally inhabited by early civilizations, the region saw influences from India, China, and the Khmer Empire. The first major Thai kingdom was Sukhothai, founded in the 13th century, which marked the beginning of the Thai cultural identity. It was followed by the powerful Ayutthaya Kingdom, which became a major trading hub and cultural center from the 14th to 18th centuries. After that the Chakri Dynasty established Bangkok as the capital, beginning the Rattanakosin era. Uniquely, Thailand remained the only Southeast Asian nation to avoid colonization, thanks to diplomatic efforts by its rulers. The country transitioned to a constitutional monarchy and was officially renamed Thailand in 1939.

Tuk-Tuk

Pha Khao Ma – Traditional Scarf

The Pha Khao Ma is a traditional Thai scarf, a versatile and practical piece of cloth used by locals for various purposes. Made from cotton, it features colorful, checkered patterns and can be worn as a sarong, headscarf, or even as a carrier for goods. This humble yet essential accessory represents Thailand's resourcefulness and strong connection to its cultural heritage.



Chut Thai – Traditional Attire

Thailand's traditional dress, Chut Thai, reflects the country's deep-rooted cultural pride and artistry. Women often wear a beautifully woven skirt called a "sinh" paired with an intricately designed top, while men don a tailored jacket with trousers or a sarong. These garments are commonly worn during festivals and ceremonies, showcasing Thailand's rich textile traditions and respect for its history.





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Thailand Visa Exemption

Thailand offers visa-free passport holders from 93 countries. Citizens of these countries will now be able to stay in Thailand for up to 60 days without requiring a visa. The 60-day stay can also be extended for another 30 days (at the discretion of Thai Immigration) enabling foreigners to reside for a total of 90 days.

Thailand Visa On Arrival

Visa on Arrival (VOA) is available for select nationalities and subject to change.

Important:

- A passport must have at least 6 months validity.
- Indicate your arrival date (you can enter after but not before the approved date).
- Bring cash (US dollars) for the stamping fee—credit cards are not accepted.
- Visa service is non-refundable and requires full payment in advance.



Thailand E-Visa

Requirements:

- Passport validity of at least 6 months and 2 blank pages.
- Two recent passport-size photos in digital format
- Credit or debit card to pay the Thailand visa fee
- Airline tickets for both arrival and departure
- Proof of accommodation bookings

Notes:

- Please apply for an E-visa for at least a month (but no longer than 3 months) before traveling.

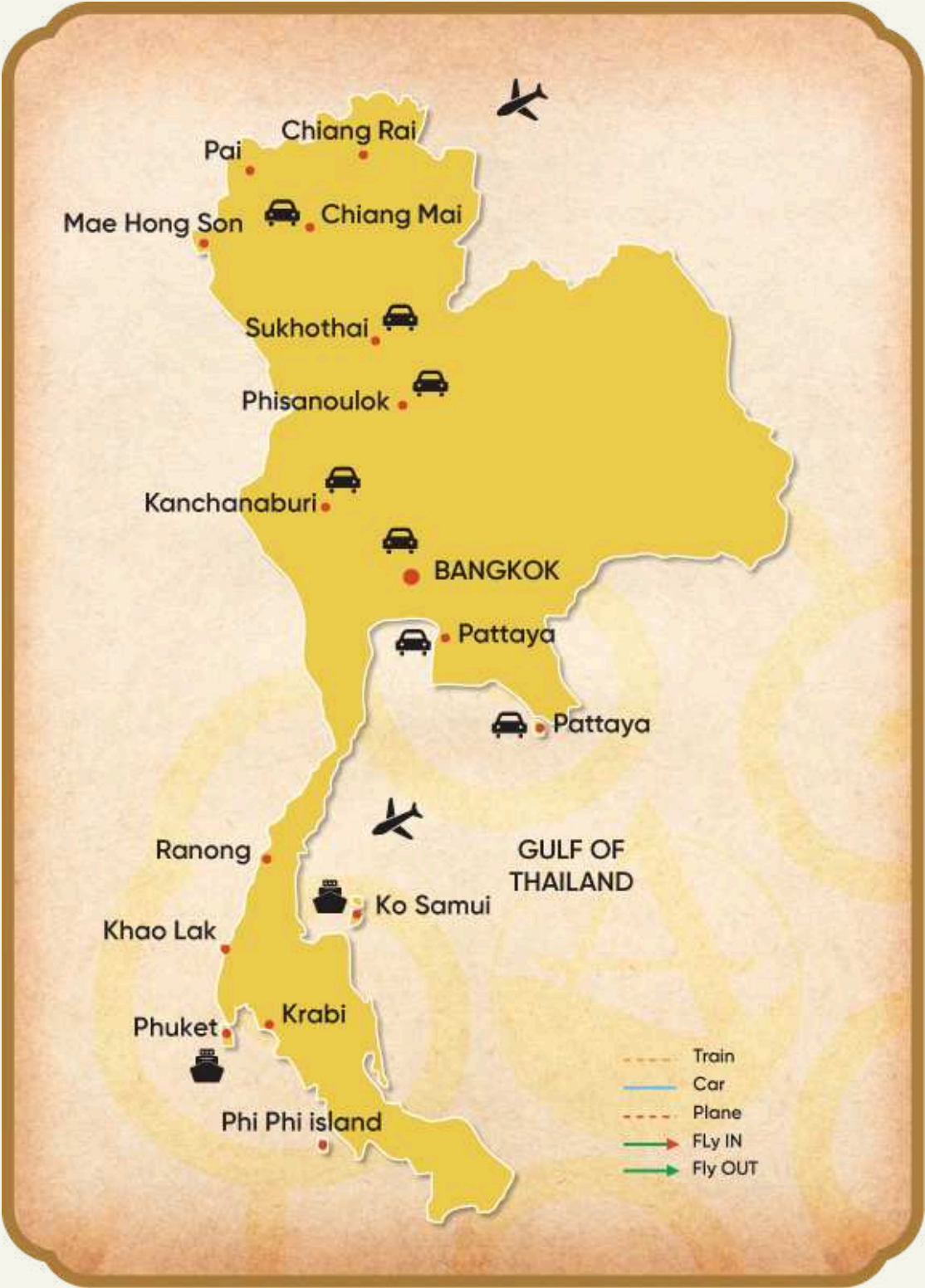


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THAILAND's climate varies by region and season

National Airlines: Varieties of options such as Bangkok Airways, Nok Air, Thai AirAsia, Thai Airways International, Thai Lion Air, etc.

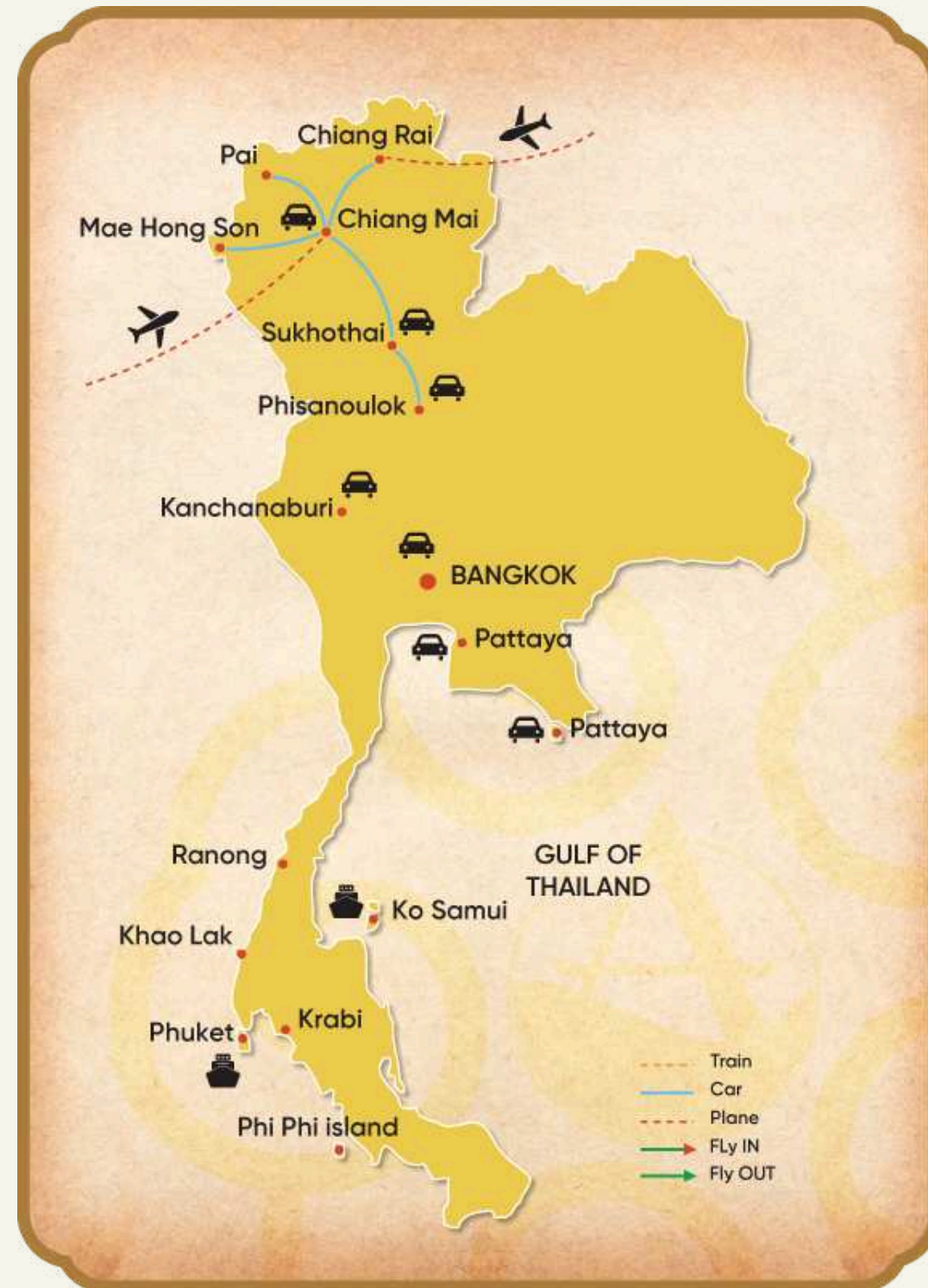

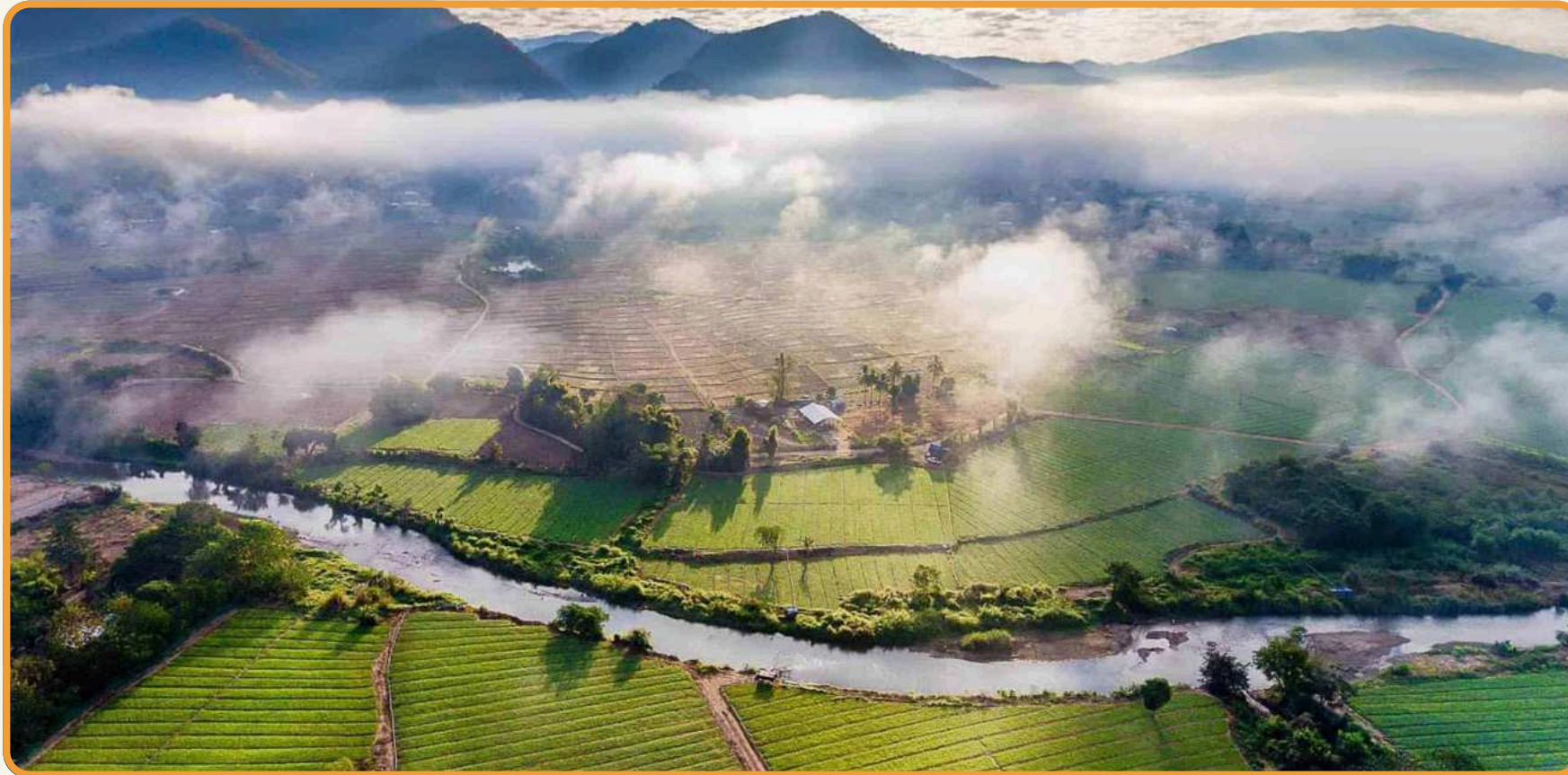

How to get there: It's about 6 hours drive from Chiang Mai, you can see along the way floral hills

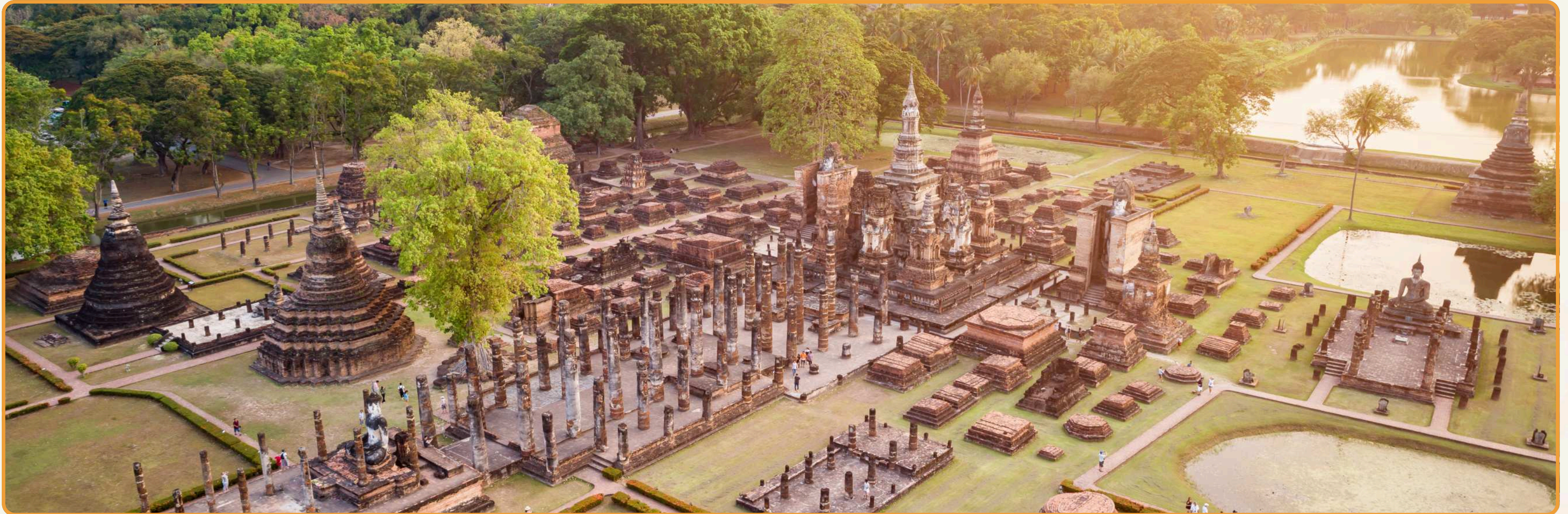

The Magnificent Temples Of Sukhothai

The enormous Buddha statue at Wat Si Chum is among the most well-known of the innumerable Buddha images found in Sukhothai. The open-roofed building housing the statue is an impressive sight as you approach it, standing approximately 50 feet tall and more than feet broad. Wat Mahathat is the ideal place to contemplate the sunset, so make your way there.



Exploring Si Satchanalai Historical Park

Even more peaceful than Sukhothai Historical Park, this region is ideal for bicycling tours. A visit to Si Satchanalai can be paired with an overnight stay in the Ban Na Ton Chan village, which has received recognition for its community-based tourism projects that help preserve historic traditions while allowing tourists to experience local culture.



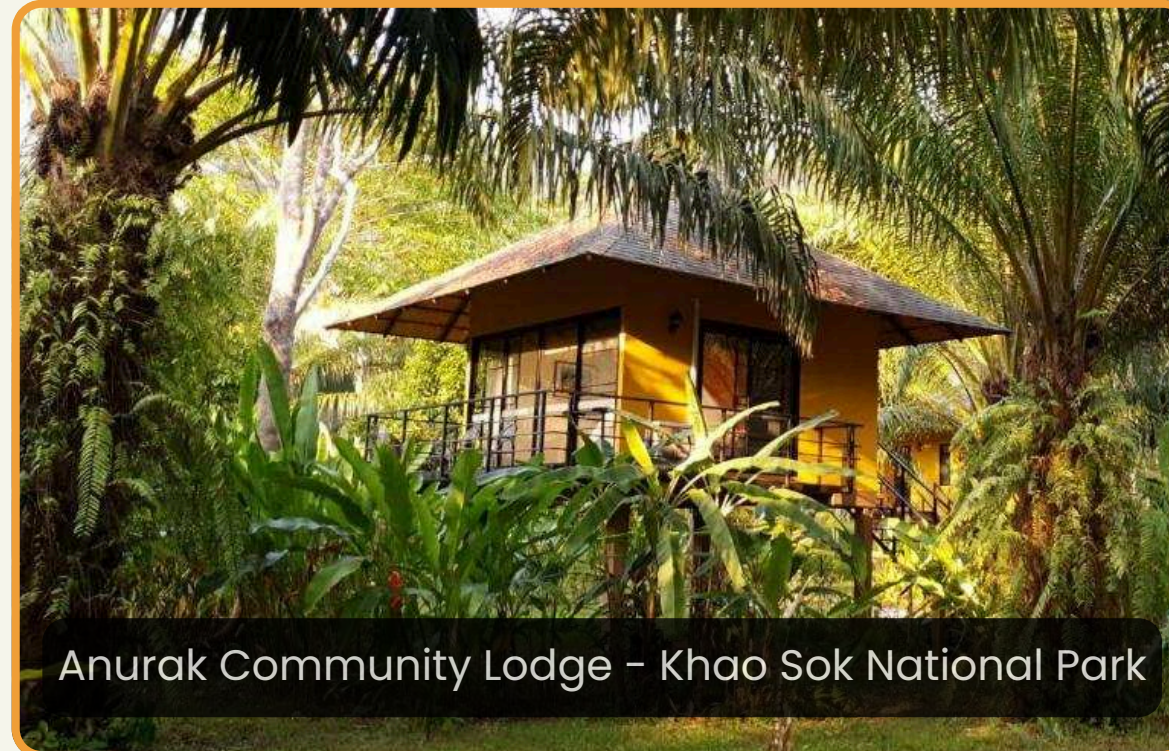

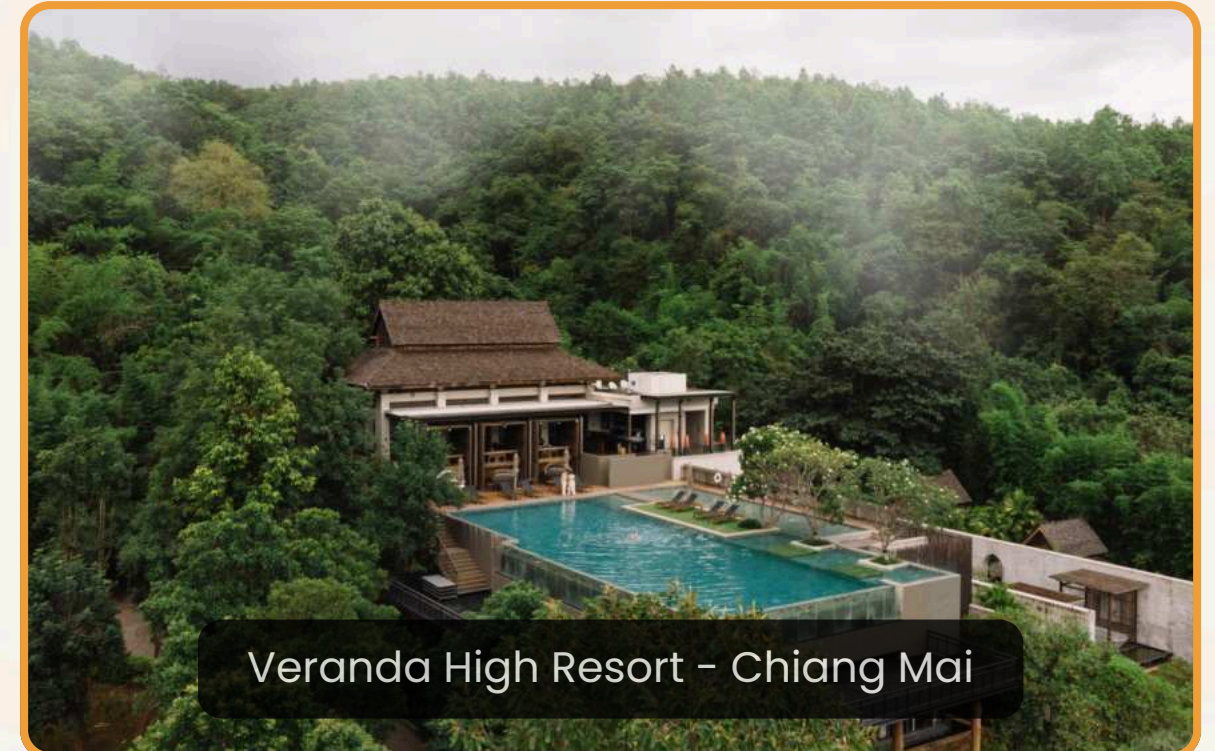

Nam Prik Noom (Green Chili Dip)

A spicy green chili dip made from roasted green chilies, garlic, and shallots, typically served with fresh vegetables and sticky rice.



Gaeng Hang Lay (Northern Pork Curry)

A slow-cooked pork curry with ginger, tamarind, and peanuts, offering a unique balance of sweet, sour, and savory flavors.



Kaeb Moo (Crispy Pork Rinds)

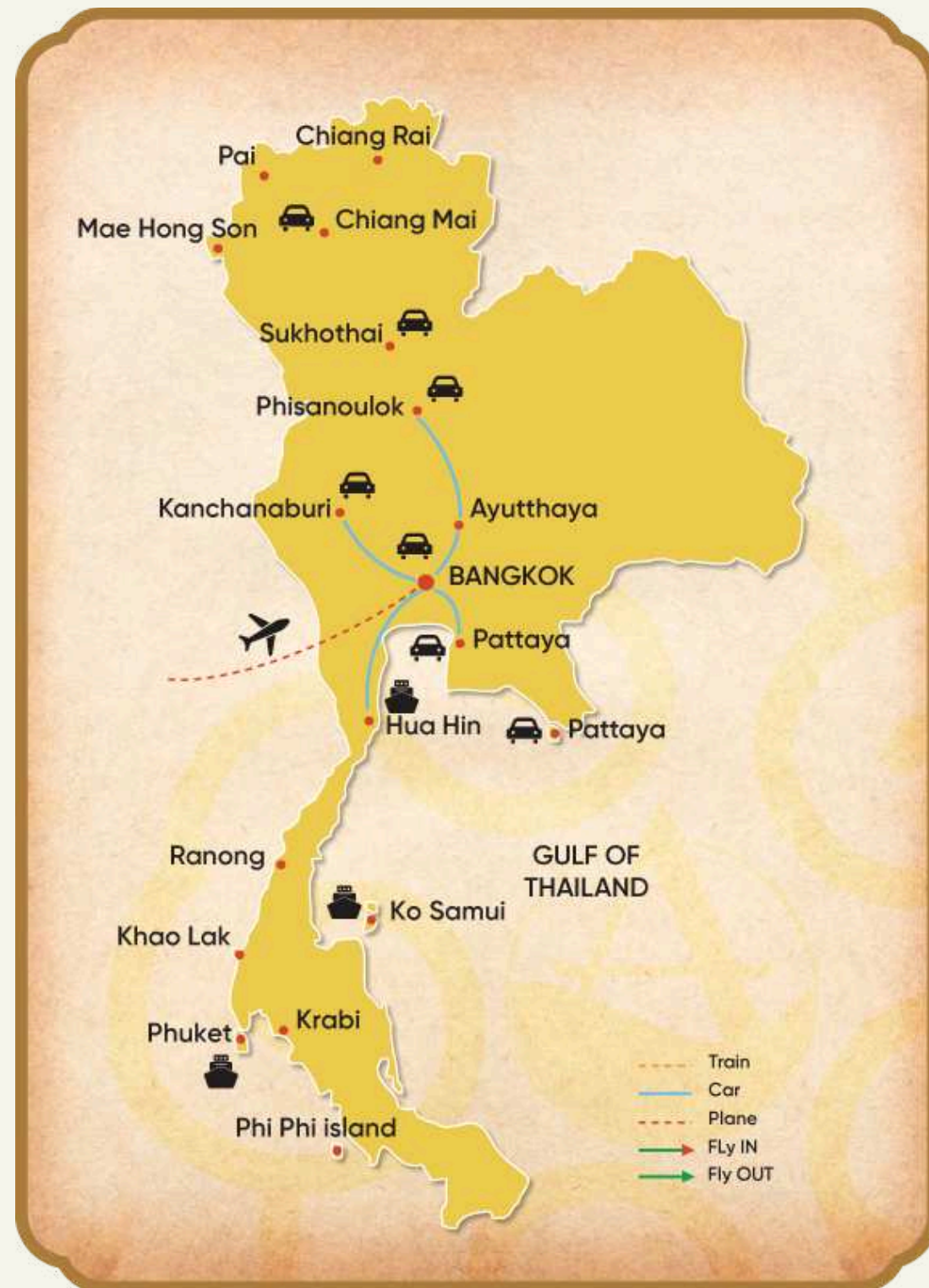
Crunchy fried pork skin, often served as a snack or paired with dips like Nam Prik Noom, provides a satisfying crunch and rich flavor.

For 417 years, Ayutthaya ruled as the capital of the Thai kingdom. King U-Thong founded the kingdom in 1350, but it collapsed in 1767 after the Burmese army destroyed it. Consolidation, repair, and reconstruction of the most prominent building remains have given visitors a glimpse of its former glory and gained the site its classification as a UNESCO World Heritage site.



Tour The Summer Palace Bang Pa-In

The royal family began using the grounds as a summer getaway in the 1700s. Nevertheless, the palace was rebuilt in the mid-nineteenth century by King Rama IV after it had been damaged during the fall of the Kingdom of Ayutthaya. Most of the structures that are still standing now were constructed during the time of King Rama V, who frequently spent his summers there.

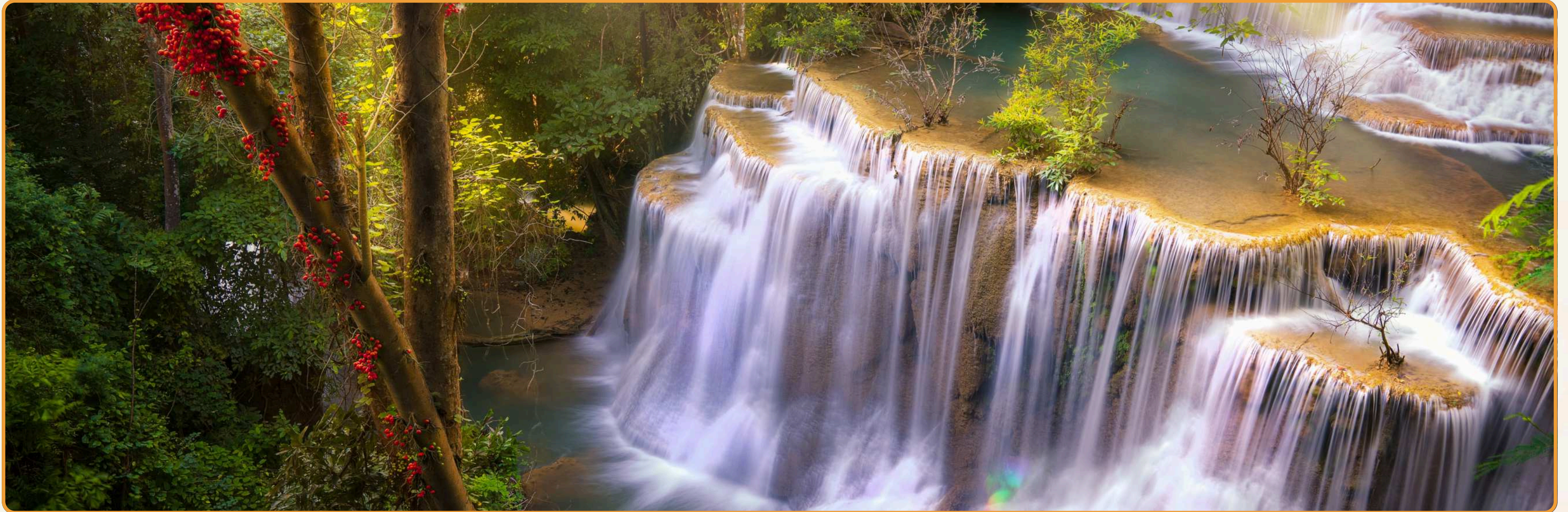

KANCHANABURI - GATEWAY TO HISTORY AND NATURE



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Kanchanaburi, a picturesque town located in western Thailand, is a captivating travel destination known for its beautiful landscapes, rich history, and outdoor adventures. Situated along the Mae Klong River. For those seeking adventure, Kanchanaburi offers activities such as river rafting, trekking, and visiting the serene Huay Mae Khamin Waterfalls.

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Retracing To The Past Of Kanchanaburi

Located at the confluence of the Kwai Noi and Kwai Yai rivers, which together make up the Mae Klong, is the city of Kanchanaburi. This is the site where the Bridge on the River Kwai and the infamous Death Railway were built, two of the most recognizable World War II landmarks that have been depicted in literature and movies.



Wildlife Immersion Tour

Located in Kanchanaburi, Erawan National Park became Thailand's 12th national park in 1975. The park is famous for its stunning turquoise waterfalls. The Hindu mythological three-headed white elephant inspired the waterfall's name, Erawan. Legend has said that the seven-tiered falls look much like the Erawan.



Peaceful Retreat On Floating Houses

Spending the nights in a floating house is a must-do while visiting Kanchanaburi. This natural sanctuary is one of very few like it on Earth. Each private floating villa is large and elegant, with pitched roofs that harmonize with the surrounding nature and local artistic traditions, and stocked with custom-tailored teakwood furnishings.



HUA HIN - SEASIDE ROYAL RETREAT



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Hua Hin, a coastal town located just a few hours south of Bangkok, is a popular travel destination known for its relaxed beach atmosphere, charming local markets, and family-friendly attractions. Once a quiet fishing village, Hua Hin gained prominence as a royal retreat, and today it combines traditional Thai charm with modern comforts, making it a favorite getaway for both locals and international visitors.

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Hua Hin Exploration

The first stop of this excursion is at Rajabhakti Park, where a row of sculptures honoring seven great rulers awaits. After seeing Hua Hin Railway Station, one of the most picturesque and historically significant stations in Thailand, go on over to Hua Hin Fresh Market, also known as "Chatchai Market," where you can peruse a wide variety of fruits, vegetables, seafood, and other fresh produce.



Pala U Waterfall

Among Thailand's most important national parks is Kaengkrachan, where you will discover the Pala U waterfall. Keep an eye out for the statue of the famous Thai Buddhist monk Laung PhorTuad at "Wat Hauymongkol" as you travel along.



Samroi yod National Park

A trip to "Khao Samroi yod," Thailand's first marine national park, is our destination today. Begin your journey from Bangpu Beach to Laemsala Beach by visiting a pineapple farm and the Bangpu fishing community. Afterward, take pleasure in hiking through picturesque scenery to the "Prayanakorn cave."



Wild Elephants Watching In Kui Buri National Park

Located 1.5 hours' drive south of Hua Hin, the devoted wildlife viewing area in Kui Buri National Park is home to an astounding 95% likelihood of seeing the majestic beasts, making it famous as the best place in Thailand to observe wild elephants. Explore the jungle in a ranger vehicle while taking in the sights of nature and wild elephants.

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Koh Samet

Koh Samet is a small, picturesque island near Bangkok, famous for its white sandy beaches, clear blue waters, and vibrant nightlife. A favorite weekend getaway, it offers a blend of relaxation and excitement, with cozy beachside resorts and lively bars.

How to get there: From Bangkok take a bus or private car to Ban Phe Pier in Rayong (about 3.5 hours). From there, ferries and speedboats run regularly, reaching the island in about 30-45 minutes.



Koh Chang

Koh Chang, Thailand's second-largest island, is a lush paradise known for its beautiful beaches, waterfalls, and rugged jungles. A mix of lively beaches and tranquil spots, it offers something for everyone—from relaxing at beach resorts to exploring the island's hiking trails and marine life.

How to get there: From Bangkok take a ride to Laem Ngop Pier in Trat (approximately 5-6 hours), then board a ferry, which takes about 30-45 minutes to reach the island.



Koh Kood

Koh Kood is a serene and unspoiled island in the Gulf of Thailand, known for its crystal-clear waters, palm-fringed beaches, and lush jungle landscapes. Perfect for relaxation and off-the-beaten-path exploration, it's ideal for those seeking peace and natural beauty.

How to get there: From Bangkok, take a bus or flight to Trat, then a taxi to Laem Sok Pier. From there, speedboats and ferries operate to Koh Kood, taking around 1-1.5 hours.



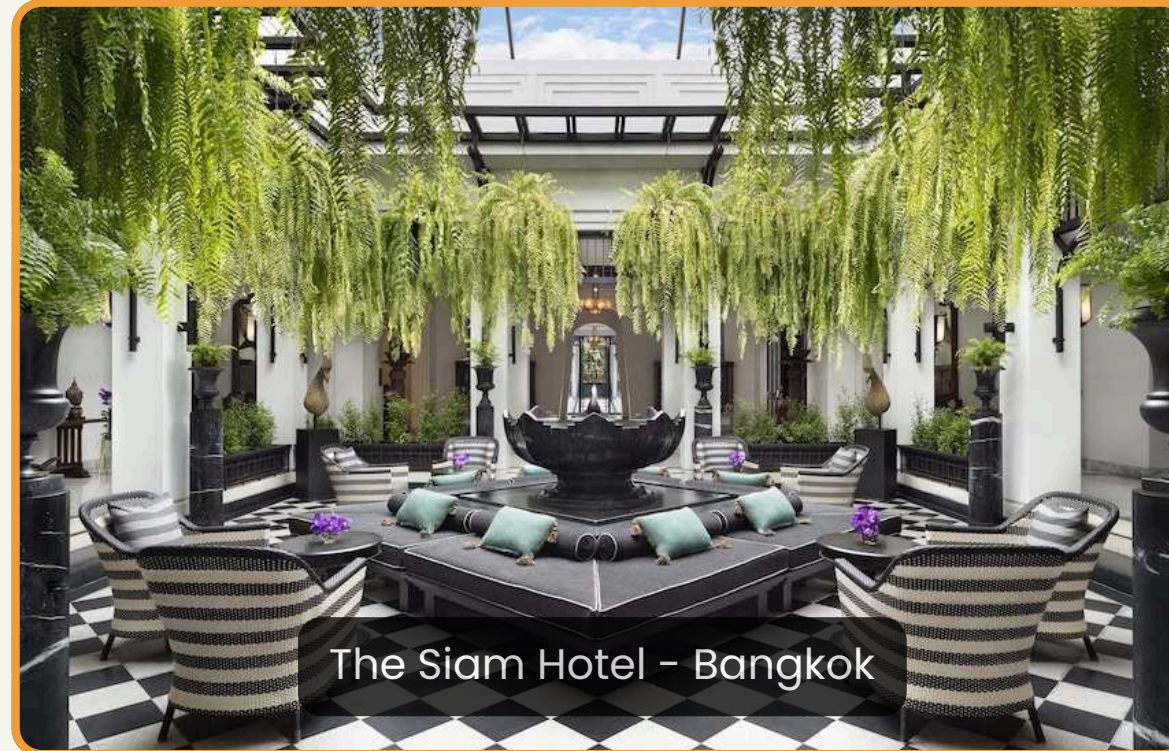

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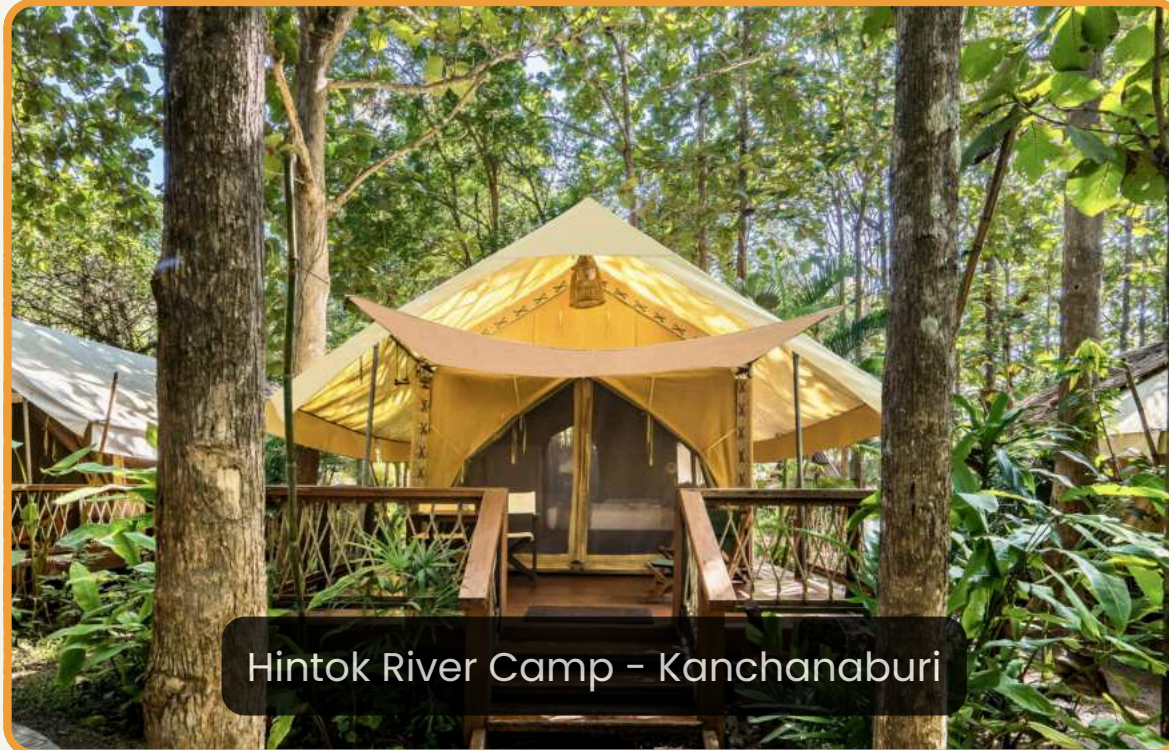

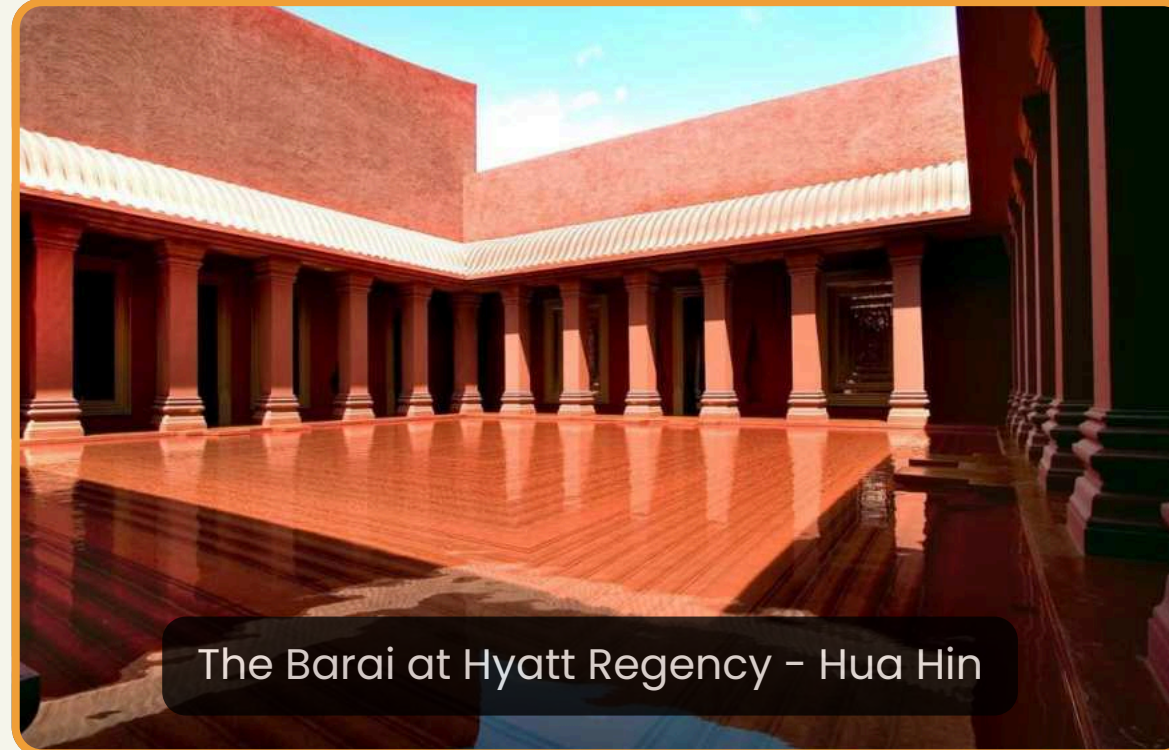

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Pad Thai

Thailand's iconic stir-fried noodle dish with shrimp, tofu, eggs, bean sprouts, and peanuts, often seasoned with tamarind sauce and lime for a perfect balance of sweet, sour, and salty.



Tom Yum Goong

A spicy and sour soup made with shrimp, lemongrass, kaffir lime leaves, galangal, and chili, delivering a bold and aromatic flavor.



Khao Man Gai

Thailand's version of chicken rice consists of tender poached chicken served over fragrant rice with a side of spicy, garlic dipping sauce, and a bowl of clear broth.



Green Curry (Gaeng Keow Wan)

A creamy, mildly spicy curry made with coconut milk, green curry paste, and a mix of vegetables and meat, often served with steamed rice.



Som Tum (Green Papaya Salad)

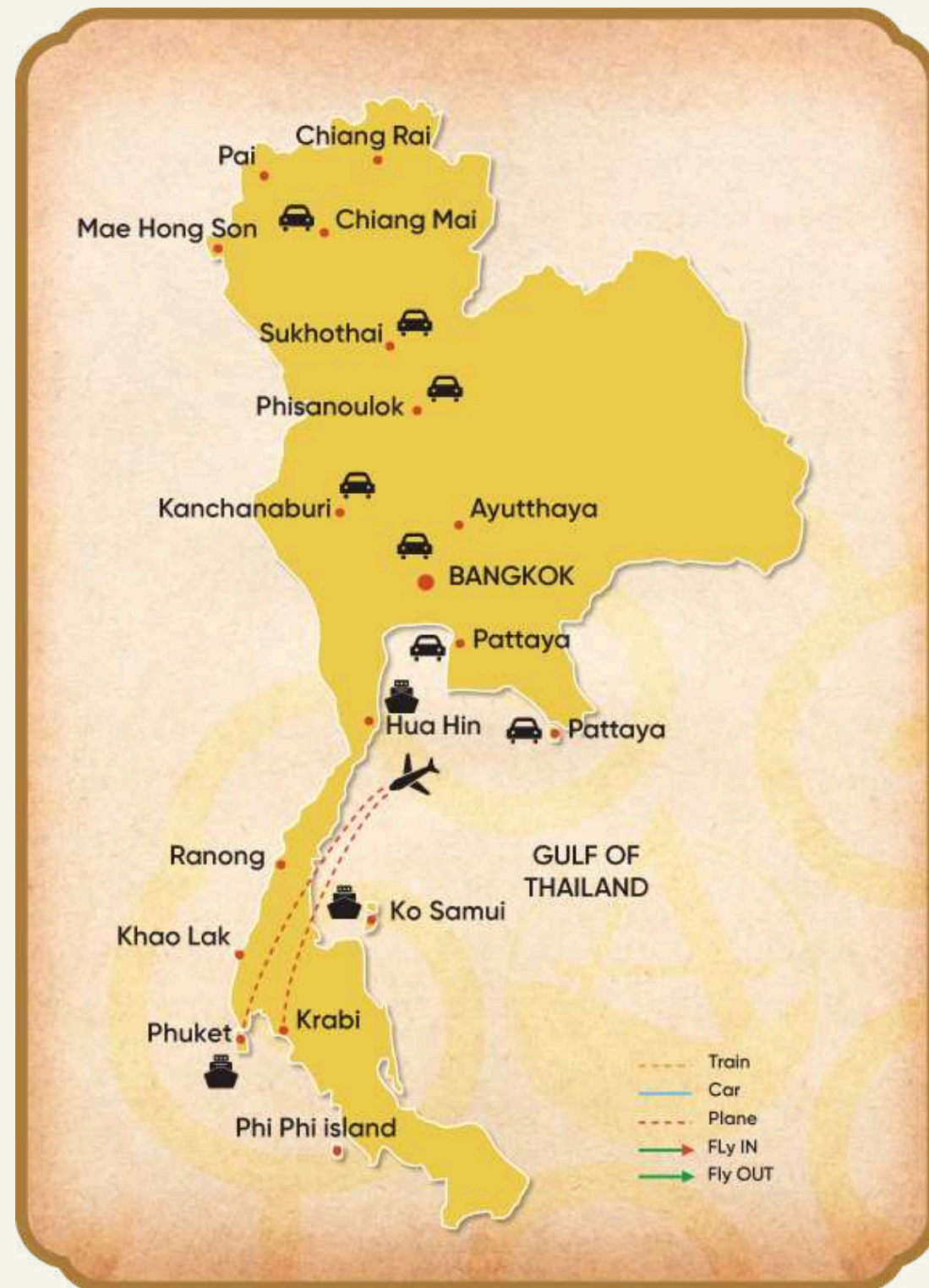
A fresh and crunchy salad made from shredded green papaya, tomatoes, peanuts, lime, and chilies, offering a delicious combination.

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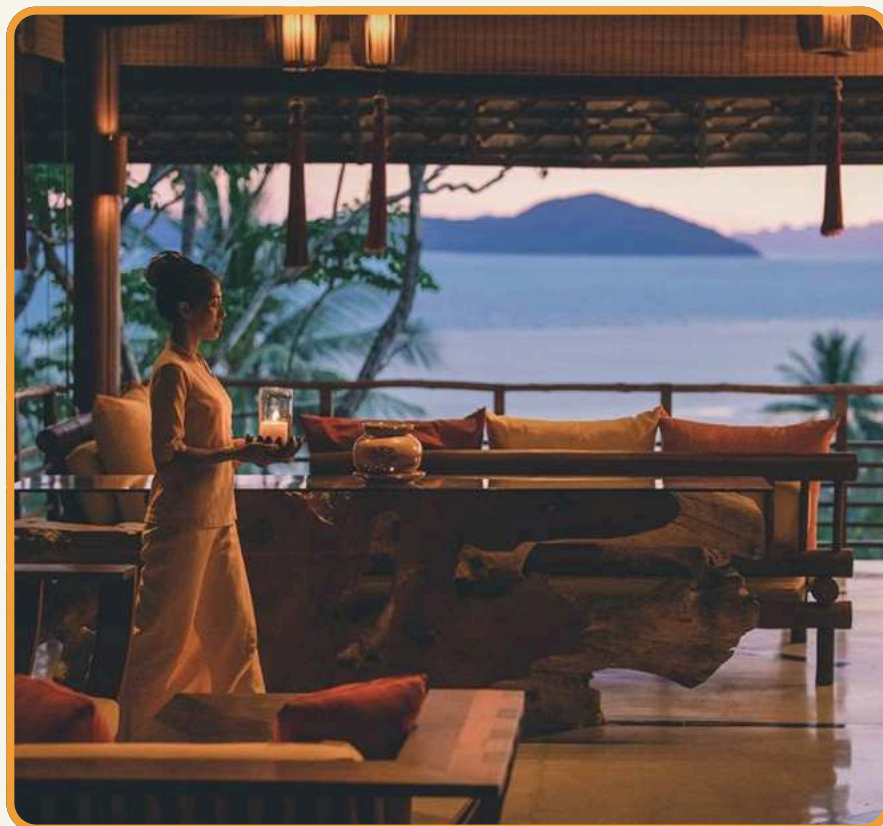

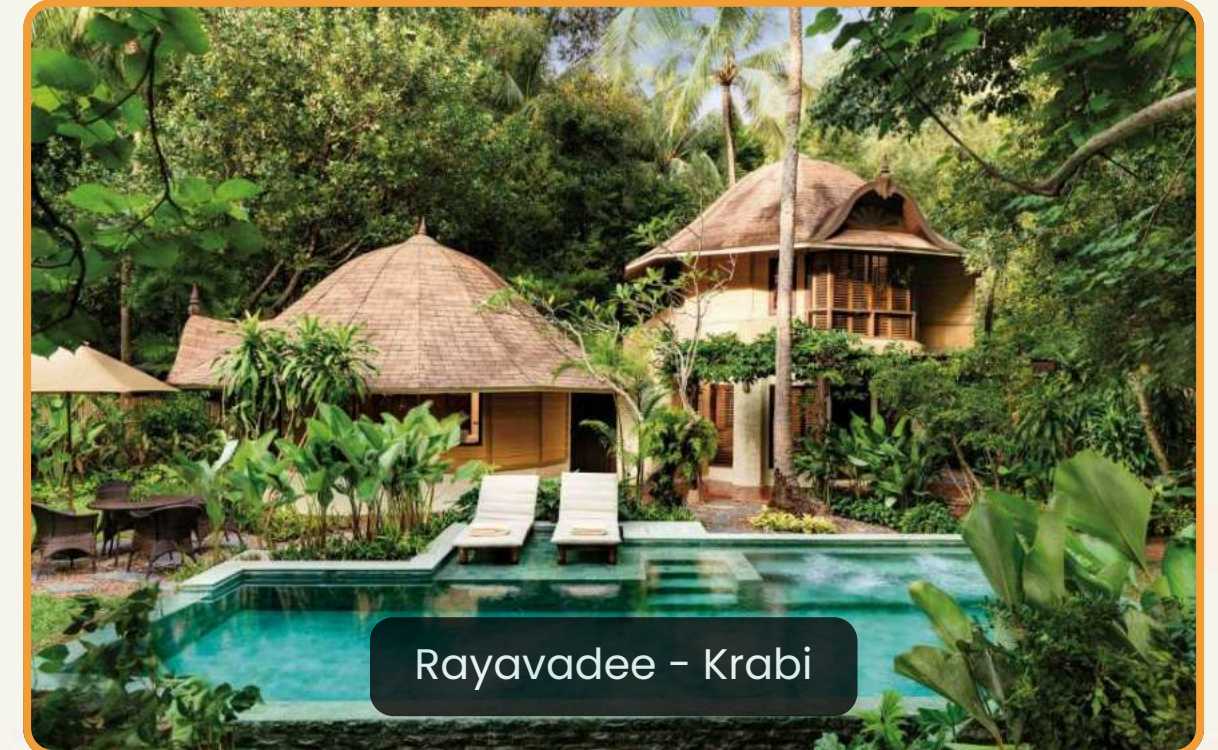

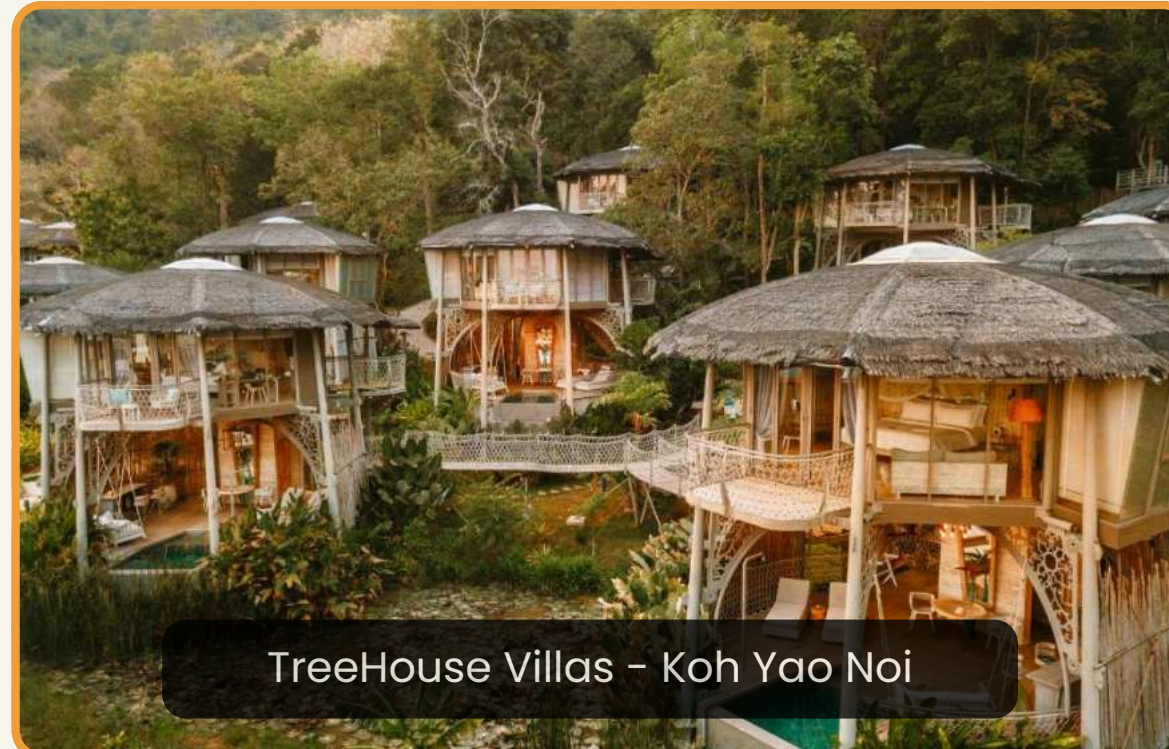

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Gaeng Som Pla

A spicy and sour fish curry made with turmeric and tamarind, known for its bold and tangy flavors, typically served with steamed rice.



Khanom Jeen

Thin rice noodles are served with various Southern Thai curries, including fish or crab curries, fresh herbs, pickled vegetables, and boiled eggs.



Khao Yam

A Southern Thai rice salad mixed with fresh herbs, dried shrimp, and grated coconut, and served with a tangy, slightly sweet dressing.



Pad Sataw

A stir-fried dish featuring the uniquely bitter stinky beans (sataw) cooked with shrimp or pork in a spicy chili paste, a true Southern specialty.



Thai Roti

Indian-style flatbread is often served with sweetened condensed milk or as a savory dish with curry, perfect for breakfast or a snack.
