Motorbike

An official transport in Vietnam is MOTORBIKE. There are about 40 million motos for a population of 90 million people. And prepare yourself to see almost everything on them: 1,2 or 3 people at the same time, children, dogs, cages, refrigerators, bags,... They can carry everything on only one motor.

And to cross the street, the motto is KEEP GOING! just go! They will deviate from you !

Vietnamese Hat

One of the most tipical scenes of Vietnam is the Vietnamese hats. Every Vietnamese person uses it, either on the streets or in parks. They use it to protect themselves from the sun Is impossible to go to Vietnam and come back without its traditional hat.



Vietnamese Traditional Dress

The traditional Vietnamese dress for women," Ao dai", consists of a long robe (glued to the body) over pantaloon-style pants.

The specialty of the "Ao dai" is that it is a tight-fitting dress that magnifies the beautiful curves of a woman's body. The slits on both sides up to the waist create a charming and unique cut that is classically flattering.

VIETNAM VISA



Vietnam Visa Exemption

As of August 2023, regular passport holders from the following countries do not need a tourist visa for Vietnam:

• 90 days: Chile, Panama

• 45 days: Belarus, South Korea, Japan, Germany, Denmark, Norway, Russia, France, Finland, Spain, Sweden, Italy, UK (excluding British Overseas citizens)

- 30 days: Cambodia, Indonesia, Kyrgyzstan, Laos, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand
- **21 days:** Philippines
- 14 days: Brunei, Myanmar



Vietnam Visa On Arrival

A visa on Arrival (VOA) is needed to apply and be approved before departure. Only with an Approval Letter, then a VOA be issued on arrival

Important:

- Passport validity of at least 6 months and 2 blank pages
- Indicate your arrival date (you can enter after but not before the approved date)
- Bring cash (USD25 per person) for the stamping fee; credit cards are not accepted
- Visa service fee is non-refundable and requires full payment in advance

Vietnam E-Visa

Requirements:


- Passport validity of at least 6 months and 2 blank pages
- One recent passport-size photo in digital format
- E-visa fee: USD 25 (single entry), USD 50 (multiple entry), non-refundable

Notes:

- Typically 3 working days, but delays may occur due to high volume or holidays.
- Each application is for one person, no group applications.
- Vietnam E-visa can be applied at: evisa.xuatnhapcanh.gov.vn

VIETNAM ROAD WAY TRANSPORTATION

Traffic Conditions: Vietnam's roads can be busy, especially in major cities like Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City, with motorbikes dominating the streets.

Road Quality: Main highways and roads between cities are generally in good condition, but rural and mountainous areas may have rough or narrow roads.

Safety: Seat belts are required by law for all passengers in cars. Helmets are mandatory for motorbike riders.

Transport Options: Aurora Travel & DMC offers all types of vehicles, including 4, 7, 16, 35, and 45-seater cars, ensuring comfortable transportation for groups of any size.

VIETNAM RAIL WAY TRANSPORTATION

Railway Network: Vietnam's railway system connects major cities from north to south, with the main line running from Hanoi to Ho Chi Minh City.

Travel Time: Train travel is much slower than flying, but it offers scenic views, especially on routes like Da Nang to Hue or vice versa.

Train Classes: Trains offer various seat and cabin classes, from soft seats to sleeper cabins (Both 4-berth and 6-berth options).

Onboard Comfort: Sleeper trains offer comfortable beds, and most long-distance trains have air conditioning and dining carts.

Transport Options: We offer some options of overnight trains: such as Hanoi – Sapa & Hanoi - Hue or Hanoi - Danang.





Ninh Binh is a 2-hour drive from/to Hanoi and a 3-hour drive from/to Halong Bay.



Pu Luong is an area filled with charming villages and hamlets, each with its fascinating history. The majority of the reserve's population is Thai, a people group that includes both White Thai and Black Thai groups.



Sapa is surrounded by terraced rice fields, misty mountains, and lush valleys, Sapa offers visitors a peaceful escape into nature. The region is also home to several ethnic minority groups, such as the Hmong and Dao, giving travelers a unique opportunity to experience local traditions, vibrant markets, and colorful clothing.

The first option is to take the 8-9 hour overnight train from Hanoi. You depart at night and wake up the next morning in Lao Cai then move to Sapa. Another option is to drive from Hanoi to Lao Cai on the new route for 4.5 hours, then 1 hour to Sapa.

Ha Giang

How to get there: Head to North East with a total of 300km in distance & a 7-hour drive duration from Hanoi

The region is famous for its enormous annual rice harvest, which, when viewed at the correct time of year, creates breathtaking views of verdant and golden hues. You can visit several distinct villages belonging to the H'mong, Nung, and Dao ethnic groups

How to get there: It's about 6.5 hours drive from Hanoi, you can see along the way mountains & rice fields

Things to do: Trek through paddy rice fields and hill tribe villages, Admire the beauty of paddy rice fields, Experience local homestays






Mu Cang Chai

How to get there: It's about 6 hours drive from Hanoi, you can see along the way mountains & rice fields





WHAT TO EAT WHEN VISIT NORTHERN VIETNAM



Phở

The most famous Vietnamese dish, Phở is a flavorful noodle soup made with a savory broth, tender beef or chicken, and fresh herbs. It's a must-try and a staple of the Vietnam street food scene.



Bún Chả A delicious dish of grilled pork patties served with vermicelli noodles, fresh herbs, and a tangy dipping sauce.



Bánh Cuốn

These delicate, steamed rice rolls are filled with minced pork and mushrooms and served with a side of fragrant fish sauce.





Chả Cá Lã Vọng A unique Hanoian specialty, Chả Cá is turmeric-marinated fish fried with dill and spring onions, typically served with vermicelli, peanuts, and a special dipping sauce.


Cà Phê Trứng (Egg Coffee)

This destination can be reached via a daily direct flight from Hanoi or Ho Chi Minh City. You can also enjoy a scenic 4-hour drive from Hue .

Leisure Boat Ride And Cave Exploration

The breathtaking mountain ranges in Phong Nha-Ke Bang National Park, which has been on the UNESCO World Heritage List since 2003, may be seen from a boat ride along the Son River, making it an ideal activity for nature lovers. The cave is divided into two parts: dry caves at an altitude of 200 meters and wet caves with an underground river.
